



SUNFLOWER GRANNY SQUARE CROCHET TUTORIAL

Step-by-Step Guide from Start to Finish

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- Worsted Weight Cotton Yarn
 - Brown (Center)
 - Yellow (Petals)
 - Green (Leaves/Background)
 - Cream/White (Border)
- Crochet Hook: 5.0 mm (H) or size needed for your gauge
- Yarn Needle
- Scissors ✂

- Stitch Markers (optional)

YARN WEIGHT GUIDE



MEDIUM



FINISHED SIZE (approx.)

5.5 in / 14 cm square
(with worsted weight yarn and 5.0 mm hook)



BASIC STITCHES (US TERMS)



Slip Knot (slipknot)

Make a loop, pull yarn through, and tighten on hook.



Chain (ch)

Yarn over, pull through loop on hook.



Slip Stitch (sl st)

Insert hook, yarn over, pull through both loops on hook.



Single Crochet (sc)

Insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.



Double Crochet (dc)

Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through last 2 loops.



Treble Crochet (tr)

Yarn over twice, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops (3 times), yarn over, pull through last 2 loops.



Double Crochet Cluster (dc-cluster)

Yarn over, insert hook, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops. Repeat 2 more times in same stitch, yarn over, pull through all 4 loops. (Creates petals)

PATTERN OVERVIEW



- R1: Brown Center
- R2: Yellow Petals
- R3: Green Leaves
- R4: Cream Border

NOTES

- Ch 3 at the beginning of a round counts as a dc.
- Join rounds with a sl st unless otherwise stated.
- Ch spaces (ch-sp) are spaces made by chain stitches.

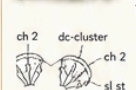
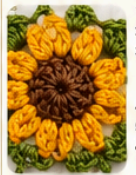
ROUND 1 – BROWN CENTER



1. Make a magic ring.
2. Ch 2 (does not count as a stitch).
3. Work 12 dc into the ring.
4. Pull the ring tight.
5. Join with sl st to top of first dc. (12 dc)

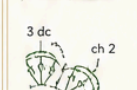


ROUND 2 – YELLOW PETALS



1. Join yellow yarn in any stitch.
2. Ch 3 (counts as dc).
3. In the same stitch, work 2 dc-cluster (3 dc-cluster total) (Each petal = 3 dc-cluster).
4. Ch 2.
5. Skip 1 stitch, sl st in next stitch.
6. Repeat from * around. You will have 12 petals.
7. Join with sl st to top of first dc. (12 petals)

ROUND 3 – GREEN LEAVES



1. Join green yarn in any ch-2 space.
2. Ch 3 (counts as dc).
3. Work 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in the same ch-2 space. (Leaf corner made)
4. Skip the sl st and the next dc, sl st in next ch-2 space.
5. Repeat from * around. You will have 4 leaf corners.
6. Join with sl st to top of first dc. (4 leaf corners)

ROUND 4 – CREAM BORDER



1. Join cream yarn in any corner (ch-2 space).
2. Ch 3 (counts as dc).
3. Work 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in the same corner space.
4. Work 1 dc in each stitch and 2 dc in each ch-2 corner space around.
5. Join with sl st to top of first dc. (4 corners with 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc)



FINISHING



1. Fasten off and weave in ends with yarn needle.
2. Block your square gently to even the edges.
3. Make as many squares as needed and join to create blankets, bags, pillows, and more! ♥

- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- st(s) = stitch(es)
- sp = space
- dc-cluster = double crochet cluster
- rep = repeat
- rnd(s) = round(s)

SPECIAL METHODS



Magic Ring
Create an adjustable ring for a tight center.



Join with Slip Stitch
Insert hook into first stitch, yarn over, pull through.



Change Color
Yarn over with new color on the last yarn over step.



Weave in Ends
Use yarn needle to hide yarn tails inside stitches.

TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- Keep your tension even.
- Count your stitches each round.
- Use stitch markers to mark the beginning of each round.
- Blocking helps your squares lay flat and look neat.

CROCHET PROJECT IDEAS

CARE INSTRUCTIONS



Hand wash cold



Lay flat to dry



Do not bleach



Low heat iron if needed

Sunflower Granny Square

CROCHET PATTERN

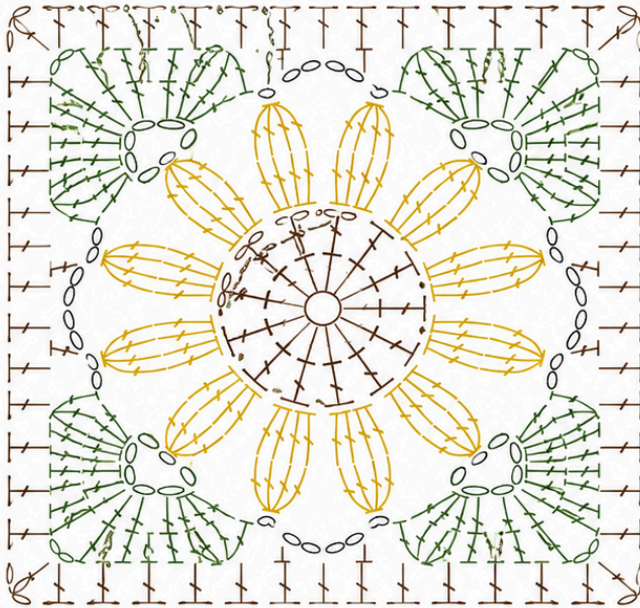


MATERIALS

- Worsted weight (4) yarn
 - Brown (center)
 - Yellow (petals)
 - Green (leaves)
 - Cream or White (border)
- 4.0 mm (G) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors

FINISHED SIZE

Approx. 4" x 4" (10 cm x 10 cm)



ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain	dc = double crochet
sl st = slip stitch	tr = treble crochet
sc = single crochet	sp = space
hdc = half double crochet	() = work into same stitch
	** = repeat instructions

TIP

Block your square lightly to bring out the sunflower shape and even the edges.

STITCH KEY (US TERMS)

- = Chain (ch)
- = Slip stitch (sl st)
- | = Single crochet (sc)
- T = Half double crochet (hdc)
- ⌋ = Double crochet (dc)
- ⌋⌋ = Treble crochet (tr)
- ⌋⌋⌋ = Double crochet cluster (3 dc)
- ⌋⌋⌋ = Treble crochet cluster (3 tr)

INSTRUCTIONS

Round 1 (Brown):

Ch 4, join with sl st to first ch to form a ring.
Ch 2 (counts as dc). 11 dc in ring. Join with sl st to top of first dc. (12 dc)

Round 2 (Yellow Petals):

Ch 1. (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in each dc around.
Join with sl st to first dc. (12 petals)

Round 3 (Green Leaves):

Sl st into the ch-2 space between petals.
(3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in each ch-2 space around.
Join with sl st. (12 leaves)

Round 4 (Cream Border):

Sl st into the ch-2 space between leaves.
Ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in same sp.
(2 hdc, ch 2, 3 hdc) in each corner space.
(3 hdc in next sp) between corners.
Join with sl st to top of first hdc.

Fasten off and weave in ends.



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Sunflower Granny Square Crochet Tutorial

Materials You Will Need

Worsted weight cotton yarn in brown, yellow, green, and cream/white.

Use brown for the sunflower center, yellow for the petals, green for the leaves/background, and cream or white for the final granny square border.

You will also need a 5.0 mm crochet hook, yarn needle, scissors, and optional stitch markers.

Finished size is approximately 5.5 inches / 14 cm square, depending on your tension.

Basic Crochet Stitches Used

This tutorial uses US crochet terms.

You should know: slip knot, chain, slip stitch, single crochet, double crochet, treble crochet, and double crochet cluster.

Abbreviations: ch = chain, sl st = slip stitch, sc = single crochet, dc = double crochet, tr = treble crochet, sp = space, rep = repeat, rnd = round.

Round 1 – Brown Sunflower Center

Start with brown yarn.

Make a magic ring.

Chain 2. This does not count as a stitch.

Work 12 double crochet stitches into the magic ring.

Pull the ring tight to close the center.

Join with a slip stitch to the top of the first double crochet.

You should have 12 dc stitches.

Round 2 – Yellow Petals

Join yellow yarn in any stitch.

Chain 3. This counts as your first double crochet.

In the same stitch, work 2 double crochet clusters to create the first petal.

Chain 2.

Slip stitch into the next stitch.

Repeat this pattern around: petal, chain 2, slip stitch into next stitch.

Continue until you have 12 yellow petals.

Join with a slip stitch to the top of the first stitch.

Round 3 – Green Leaves and Square Shape

Join green yarn into any chain-2 space.

Chain 3. This counts as a double crochet.

Work 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in the same chain-2 space. This creates your first corner.

Skip the next stitch and slip stitch into the next double crochet.

Slip stitch into the next chain-2 space.

Repeat the corner pattern around until you have 4 green corners.

Join with a slip stitch to the top of the first double crochet.

Your flower should now begin to look like a square.

Round 4 – Cream Granny Square Border

Join cream or white yarn in any corner chain-2 space.

Chain 3. This counts as a double crochet.

Work 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in the same corner space.

Along each side, work 1 double crochet in each stitch and 2 double crochet in each chain-2 space.

In every corner, work 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc.

Repeat around the full square.

Join with a slip stitch to the top of the first double crochet.

Fasten off and leave a yarn tail for weaving.

Finishing the Square

Use a yarn needle to weave in all loose ends neatly.

Block the square gently so the corners become even and the edges lay flat.

To block, lightly dampen the square, shape it into a clean square, and let it dry flat.

Make several squares and join them together to create blankets, bags, pillows, table mats, or other crochet projects.

Tips for Success 

Keep your tension even so the square does not curl.

Count your stitches at the end of every round.

Use stitch markers to mark the corners.

Do not skip blocking, because it helps the sunflower granny square look neat and professional.

Hand wash cold and lay flat to dry. Avoid bleach, and use low heat only if needed.

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
