



ROSE QUILT TUTORIAL

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

FINISHED SIZE: 50 cm x 63 cm

MATERIALS

- Assorted quilting cotton fabrics in red, pink, cream, floral prints
- Denim fabric (for accent)
- Batting
- Backing fabric
- Threads to match
- 4 Buttons (2 cm diameter)
- Fusible web (optional)
- Basic sewing & quilting tools

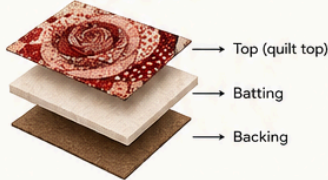
FINISHED SIZE

50 cm (W) x 63 cm (H)

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Red floral	20 x 110 cm
Pink floral	15 x 50 cm
Cream floral	20 x 60 cm
Red check/gingham	15 x 40 cm
Polka dot red	15 x 40 cm
Denim	20 x 30 cm
Pink solid	15 x 40 cm
Brown (stem)	10 x 30 cm
Green floral (leaves)	15 x 30 cm
Backing fabric	60 x 73 cm
Binding	7 x 220 cm
Batting	60 x 73 cm

QUILT LAYERS

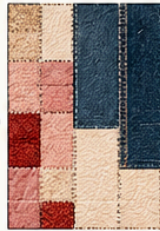


CUTTING GUIDE (Seam allowance: 0.75 cm included)

Background Blocks	Denim Panel	Stem	Leaves	Borders	Binding
Various (see layout)	20 x 30 cm (1 piece)	10 x 30 cm (1 piece)	15 x 30 cm (2 pieces)	Inner: 3 cm Outer: 5 cm	7 x 220 cm (2.5" strip)

1. BACKGROUND ASSEMBLY

1. Cut rectangles and squares in various sizes.
2. Arrange them in vertical strips as shown.
3. Sew pieces together with 0.75 cm seam allowance.
4. Press seams open.



2. ROSE APPLIQUÉ (IRISH ROSE STYLE)



1. Cut petal shapes in different fabrics.
2. Start with the center bud.
3. Add petals in a spiral.
4. Overlap and appliqué each petal.
5. Continue until the rose is complete.

- Use fusible web for easier appliqué.
- Appliqué with a small zigzag stitch or by hand with a blanket stitch.

3. STEM AND LEAVES



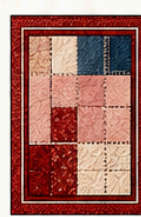
1. Cut stem and leaf shapes.
2. Position on the quilt top as shown.
3. Appliqué and stitch in place.

4. ADD DETAILS

1. Sew the denim panel on the right side.
2. Topstitch along the seams.
3. Sew 4 buttons vertically.



5. BORDERS



1. Add inner border (3 cm wide).
2. Add outer border (5 cm wide).
3. Miter corners neatly.

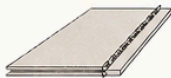
6. QUILT AND FINISH



1. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing.
2. Quilt as desired (straight lines or free motion).
3. Trim excess batting and backing.
4. Bind the edges with 7 cm binding strip.

SEWING & QUILTING METHODS (U.S. QUILT TERMS)

- 1. SEAM ALLOWANCE**
Standard 0.75 cm (1/4 inch).



- 2. PRESSING**
Press seams open or to one side.



- 3. STRAIGHT STITCH**
Use for piecing and topstitching.



- 4. APPLIQUÉ STITCH**
Zigzag or blanket stitch for appliqué pieces.



- 5. QUILTING**
Stitch through all layers to secure the quilt.



- 6. BINDING**
Sew binding strips, fold, and hand stitch to the back.



TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- Use high-quality cotton fabrics.
- Press all seams carefully.
- Take your time with the appliqué for a beautiful rose.
- Quilt lines can follow the background blocks for a stunning effect.

ROSE QUILT PATTERN TEMPLATES

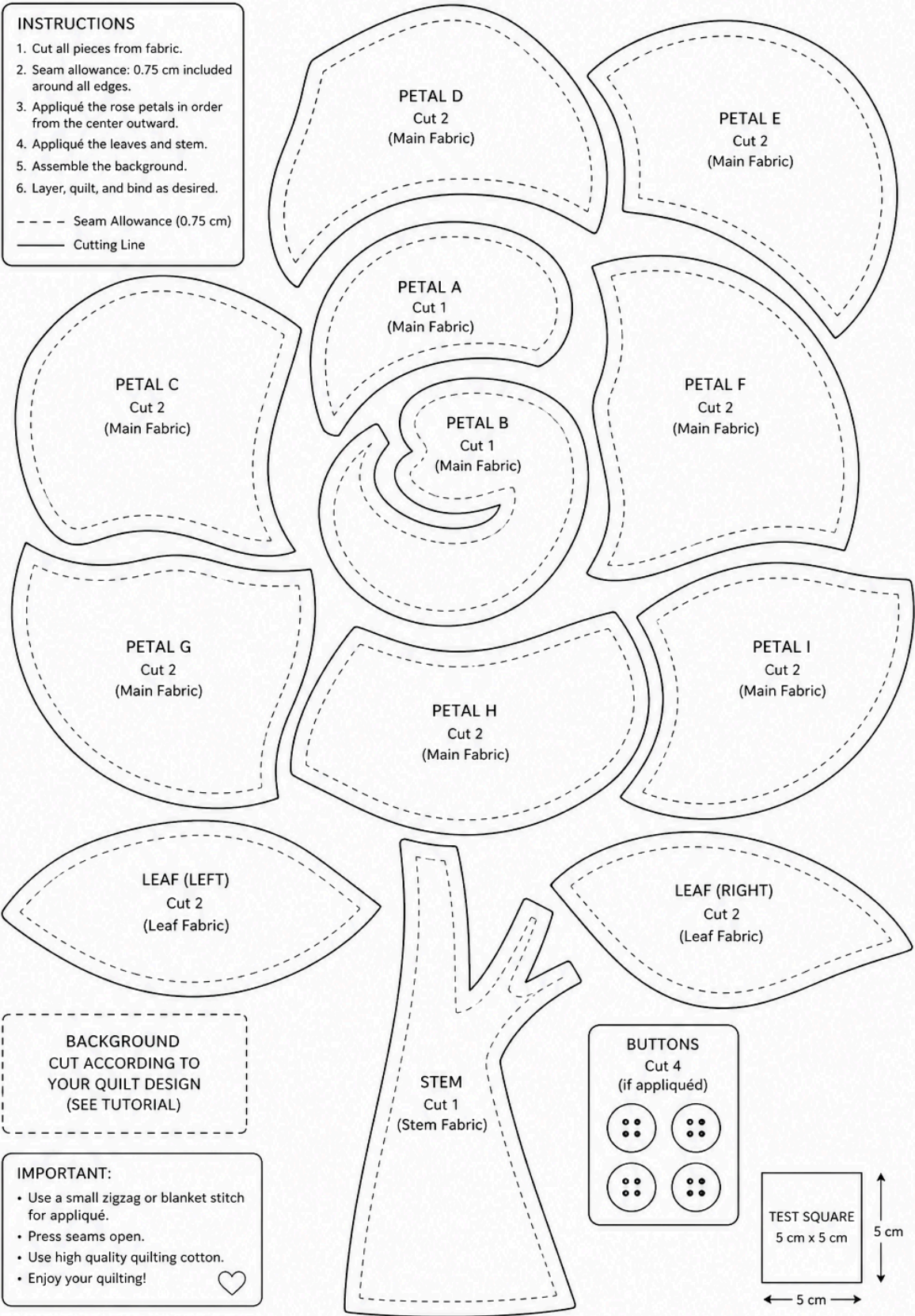


INCLUDES SEAM ALLOWANCE 0.75 cm

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut all pieces from fabric.
2. Seam allowance: 0.75 cm included around all edges.
3. Appliqué the rose petals in order from the center outward.
4. Appliqué the leaves and stem.
5. Assemble the background.
6. Layer, quilt, and bind as desired.


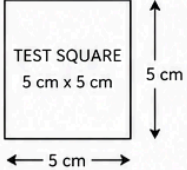

Rose Quilt Tutorial: Complete Step-by-Step Guide

The **Rose Quilt Tutorial** creates a finished quilt measuring **50 cm wide x 63 cm high**, approximately **19.7 inches x 24.8 inches**. This project combines patchwork background blocks, denim accent fabric, appliqué petals, a stem, leaves, borders, batting, backing, quilting, and binding.

Materials Needed

You will need assorted quilting cotton fabrics in **red, pink, cream, floral prints, gingham, and polka dots**.

Use **denim fabric** for the accent panel on the right side.

You will also need **batting, backing fabric**, matching thread, **4 buttons measuring about 2 cm**, optional fusible web, and basic sewing and quilting tools.

Recommended tools include a rotary cutter, cutting mat, quilting ruler, fabric scissors, pins or clips, iron, sewing machine, hand-sewing needle, and marking pencil.

Fabric Requirements

Cut or prepare the following fabrics:

Red floral: **20 x 110 cm**

Pink floral: **15 x 50 cm**

Cream floral: **20 x 60 cm**

Red check or gingham: **15 x 40 cm**

Polka dot red: **15 x 40 cm**

Denim: **20 x 30 cm**

Pink solid: **15 x 40 cm**

Brown fabric for the stem: **10 x 30 cm**

Green floral fabric for leaves: **15 x 30 cm**

Backing fabric: **60 x 73 cm**

Batting: **60 x 73 cm**

Binding: **7 x 220 cm**

Step 1: Prepare the Quilt Layers

This quilt has three main layers: the **quilt top**, the **batting**, and the **backing fabric**.

The quilt top is the decorative front layer, where the background blocks, rose appliqué, stem, leaves, denim panel, buttons, and borders are placed.

The batting goes in the middle and gives the quilt softness and thickness.

The backing fabric is placed on the back and should be slightly larger than the quilt top to make quilting easier.

Step 2: Cut the Background Blocks

Use cream, pink, red, and floral fabrics to cut rectangles and squares in assorted sizes.

The background is made with a patchwork layout, arranged mostly in vertical strips.

You do not need every block to be the same size. The goal is to create a soft handmade background with warm rose colors.

Use a **0.75 cm seam allowance**, which is close to **1/4 inch**, a common U.S. quilting measurement.

Arrange the blocks before sewing so you can balance light and dark fabrics across the quilt top.

Step 3: Assemble the Background

Sew the rectangles and squares together into vertical strips.

Press the seams open or to one side after each seam.

Once the strips are finished, sew them together to form the main background panel.

Keep the layout similar to the graphic: lighter cream and pink fabrics in the center, red accents on the left, and denim on the right.

Press the entire background panel flat before adding appliqué pieces.

Step 4: Add the Denim Accent Panel

Cut one denim panel measuring **20 x 30 cm**.

Place it on the right side of the quilt top.

Sew it into the background layout or appliqué/topstitch it in place, depending on your preferred construction method.

Topstitch along the denim seams for a decorative handmade look.

Sew **4 buttons vertically** on the denim panel, spacing them evenly.

Step 5: Cut the Rose Petals

Cut several curved petal shapes from red, pink, floral, polka dot, and gingham fabrics.

The petals should be different sizes to create a natural rose shape.

Start with smaller curved pieces for the center and gradually use larger petals for the outer layers.

You may use fusible web on the back of the petals to make appliqué easier.

If using fusible web, follow the manufacturer's instructions and press carefully with an iron.

Step 6: Build the Rose Appliqué

Begin with the center bud of the rose.

Place small curved petals in a spiral shape.

Add one petal at a time, overlapping each piece slightly.

Continue building outward until the rose looks full and balanced.

Mix prints and colors so the rose has depth and texture.

Once you are happy with the placement, fuse or pin the petals in place.

Step 7: Stitch the Rose

Use a small zigzag stitch, blanket stitch, or hand appliqué stitch around each petal.

Stitch carefully because the rose is the main focal point of the quilt.

Work from the center outward if possible.

Use matching or slightly darker thread for definition.

Go slowly around curves to keep the petals neat.

Press lightly when finished.

Step 8: Cut and Add the Stem

Cut a brown stem piece measuring approximately **10 x 30 cm**.

The stem should be long and slightly narrow.

Position it under the rose, extending downward.

You may cut it straight or slightly angled for a natural look.

Appliqué the stem in place using a zigzag, blanket stitch, or straight stitch close to the edge.

Step 9: Cut and Add the Leaves

Cut two leaf shapes from green floral fabric.

Each leaf should be around **15 x 30 cm total fabric allowance**, with enough fabric for two pieces.

Place the leaves on both sides of the stem.

Angle them naturally so they look like they are growing from the rose stem.

Stitch around the edges using appliqué stitch or small zigzag stitch.

You may add a center vein with straight stitching for extra detail.

Step 10: Add the Borders

Cut inner border strips approximately **3 cm wide**.

Cut outer border strips approximately **5 cm wide**.

Attach the inner border first around the quilt top.

Then attach the outer border.

For a clean finish, miter the corners neatly or sew simple straight-corner borders.

Press the borders flat after sewing.

Step 11: Make the Quilt Sandwich

Place the backing fabric wrong side up.

Lay the batting on top of the backing.

Place the quilt top right side up over the batting.

Smooth all layers carefully.

Pin, baste, or use temporary spray adhesive to hold the layers together.

Make sure there are no wrinkles before quilting.

Step 12: Quilt the Layers

Quilt through all three layers to secure the quilt.

You can use straight-line quilting, free-motion quilting, or gentle wavy lines.

The graphic suggests simple quilting lines that enhance the handmade texture.

Quilt around the rose carefully so the appliqué remains dimensional.

You may also quilt the background blocks and borders separately.

Trim away excess batting and backing after quilting.

Step 13: Prepare and Attach the Binding

Use binding strips totaling approximately **7 x 220 cm**.

Fold the binding lengthwise and press.

Sew the binding to the front edge of the quilt.

Fold it around to the back.

Hand stitch or machine stitch the binding in place.

Take your time around the corners for a neat finish.

Step 14: Final Size and Finishing Touches

Your finished quilt should measure about **50 cm x 63 cm**.

Check that all seams are secure.

Make sure the appliqué edges are stitched down well.

Press the quilt lightly from the back.

Add any final decorative stitching if desired.

Your handmade **Rose Quilt** is now complete! 🌹

Tips for Success

Use high-quality cotton fabrics for the best result.

Press all seams carefully as you sew.

Arrange the rose petals before stitching so you can adjust the shape.

Use pins, clips, or fusible web to keep appliqué pieces from shifting.

Keep quilting lines simple if you are a beginner.

Choose warm reds, pinks, creams, and floral prints for a romantic vintage rose effect.
