

CROCHET BOHO GRANNY BAG

Step-by-Step Tutorial

DESCRIPTION

A fun and colorful boho-style shoulder bag made with granny squares, rainbow stripes, tassels, and fringe. Perfect for everyday use and handmade gifts!

SIZE

Approx. 12 in (30 cm) wide
x 10 in (25 cm) high
(Excluding strap and fringe)

MATERIALS

- Worsted Weight Cotton Yarn (Beige + 7 Rainbow Colors)
- 5.0 mm (H) Crochet Hook
- Yarn Needle
- Scissors
- Stitch Markers
- Measuring Tape
- Cardboard (for tassels, optional)

YARN COLORS

- Beige (Main)
- Hot Pink
- Orange
- Yellow
- Green
- Turquoise
- Lavender

STITCH GUIDE (US TERMS)

- ch Chain
sl st Slip Stitch
sc Single Crochet
hdc Half Double Crochet
dc Double Crochet
T Treble Crochet

ABBREVIATIONS

- ch = chain
sl st = slip stitch
sc = single crochet
hdc = half double crochet
dc = double crochet
tr = treble crochet
st(s) = stitch(es)
sp = space
rep = repeat
() = work into same stitch

1 GRANNY SQUARES (MAKE 3)

With Color 1 (Pink).

- 1) ch 4, sl st to first ch to form a ring.
- 2) Round 1: ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in ring. (3 dc groups)
- 3) Round 2: Join Color 2. In each ch-2 sp: 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc. Join.
- 4) Round 3: Join Color 3. In each ch-2 sp: 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc. Join.
- 5) Round 4: Join Color 4. Repeat around. Fasten off.



Make 3 squares in same colors.

2 FRONT AND BACK PANELS

Join squares as shown.



Row 1 (Bottom of Squares): With Beige, sc evenly across the bottom of the 3 joined squares.

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sc across.

Repeat Rows 1-2 for 4 more rows.

3 RAINBOW STRIPES

Change to rainbow colors.
Work in rows across the top.



- Row 1: With Hot Pink, hdc across.
Row 2: With Orange, hdc across.
Row 3: With Yellow, hdc across.
Row 4: With Green, hdc across.
Row 5: With Turquoise, hdc across.
Row 6: With Lavender, hdc across.
Repeat Rows 1-6 once more.

4 TOP EDGE AND OPENING

With Beige.

- Row 1: sc across.
Row 2: ch 3 (counts as dc), dc across.
Row 3: sc across.
Row 4: dc across.
Fasten off.

Fold panel in half. With Beige, Work sc evenly down the side, across the bottom, and up the other side.



6 STRAP

With Beige.

ch 120 (adjust length to you like)

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and across.

Row 2-Row 6: ch 1, turn, sc across.
Fasten off.

Sew strap ends securely to top sides of bag.



7 TASSEL TIE (CLOSURE)

Make a chain with Beige.



ch 60 (or desired length)
Add tassels to both ends.

8 TASSELS (MAKE 2)

- 1) Wrap yarn around cardboard (approx. 60-70 times).
- 2) Tie a piece of yarn tightly at the top.
- 3) Cut the bottom loops.
- 4) Wrap a small piece of yarn around the top to secure.
- 5) Trim evenly.



9 FRINGE (BOTTOM)

Cut strands of yarn (approx. 6 in / 15 cm long).

Attach fringe to the bottom edge:

- Fold in half
Pull loop through bottom edge
Pull ends through loop
Tighten



10 FINISHING

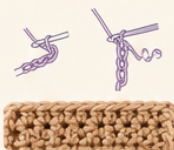
- ✓ Weave in all ends
- ✓ Block lightly if needed
- ✓ Your Boho Granny Bag is ready!



MAIN CROCHET METHODS & STITCHES (US TERMS)

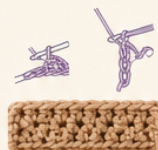
CHAIN (CH)

Yarn over, pull through the loop on hook.



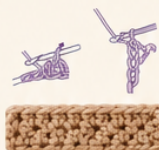
SLIP STITCH (SL ST)

Insert hook, yarn over, pull through both loops on hook.



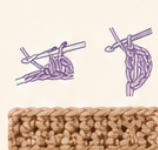
SINGLE CROCHET (SC)

Insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.



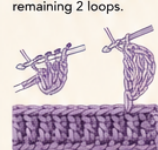
HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (HDC)

Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through all 3 loops.



DOUBLE CROCHET (DC)

Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through remaining 2 loops.



TREBLE CROCHET (TR)

Yarn over twice, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through remaining 2 loops.



TIPS

- Use tight stitches for a sturdy bag.
- Block your squares for even edges.
- Customize strap length and fringe colors!



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CROCHET BOHO GRANNY BAG!



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COLORFUL BOHO CROCHET BAG – PATTERN

MATERIALS

- Worsted weight cotton yarn in beige and multicolor
- 4.0 mm (G) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch markers
- Tassels (optional)



FINISHED SIZE

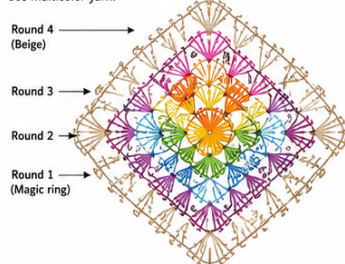
Width: 30 cm / 11.8 in
Height: 24 cm / 9.4 in
Depth: 10 cm / 3.9 in
(Strap length adjustable)

STITCH GUIDE (US TERMS)

- = Chain (ch)
- = Slip stitch (sl st)
- ⊕ = Single crochet (sc)
- ⊞ = Half double crochet (hdc)
- ⌈ = Double crochet (dc)
- ⌋ = Treble crochet (tr) (tr)
- ⦶ = Puff stitch (puff st):
Yarn over, insert hook, pull up a loop,
yarn over, pull through 2 loops.
Repeat 4 times in same stitch,
yarn over, pull through all loops on hook.
- ⦶ = Cluster (cl): 3 dc together
- ⦶ = Popcorn (pc): 5 dc in same stitch,
remove hook, insert in first dc,
pull loop through, ch 1 to secure.

GRANNY DIAMOND MOTIF (Make 2)

Use multicolor yarn.



Round 1: Magic ring, ch 1,
8 sc in ring, sl st to first sc. (8)

Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc),
2 dc in same st, ch 1, *3 dc in
next st, ch 1; repeat from *
around, sl st to top of ch 3. (24)

Round 3: Ch 1, puff st in same st,
ch 1, *puff st in next dc, ch 1;
repeat from * around, sl st to
first puff st. (12 puff sts)

Round 4: Ch 3 (counts as dc),
2 dc in same st, dc in next st,
3 dc in next corner (ch-1 space),
*dc in next 2 sts, 3 dc in next
corner; repeat from * around,
sl st to top of ch 3. Fasten off.

BAG BODY

Use beige yarn.

Base: Ch 32.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook
and across. (31)

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc across.
Repeat Row 2 until base measures
30 cm / 11.8 in. Fasten off.

Sides:

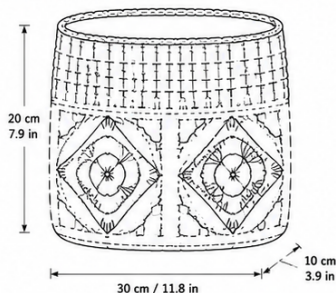
Round 1: Join yarn, sc evenly
around the base. (90 sc approx.)

Rounds 2–3: Ch 1, sc in each st
around. (90)

Insert Motifs:

Round 4: Place the 2 granny
diamond motifs on opposite sides
of the bag. Join motifs as you go
(see diagram). Sc in each st and
ch space around. (90+)

Rounds 5–9: Ch 1, sc in each st
around until bag height is
20 cm / 7.9 in.



RAINBOW STRIPE PANEL (Top Section)

Use multicolor yarn.

Row 1: Attach yarn, ch 1, sc in each st around.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in each st around.
Repeat Rows 1–2, changing color every row
(6–7 colors) for a total of 8 rows.



FRINGE (Bottom Edge)

Attach fringe in multicolor.

Cut yarn pieces 15 cm / 5.9 in.
Fold in half and knot into
each stitch along the bottom edge.



DRAWSTRING & STRAP

Drawstring: Ch 120, sl st in
2nd ch from hook and across.
Weave through top row.

Strap: Ch 8, sc in 2nd ch
from hook and across.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc across.
Repeat until strap measures
120 cm / 47 in. Fasten off.

Tassels (make 2): Wrap
multicolor yarn around your
hand, tie at top, cut loops
at bottom, wrap a small
piece around top to secure.



ASSEMBLY

Weave in all ends.
Block lightly to shape.
Your boho bag is ready!



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Crochet Boho Granny Bag: Complete Step-by-Step Tutorial

This colorful Crochet Boho Granny Bag combines traditional granny squares, rainbow stripes, decorative tassels, and a long shoulder strap. The finished bag measures approximately 12 inches wide by 10 inches high (30 × 25 cm), not including the strap or fringe.

This tutorial uses US crochet terminology. The bag is worked in several sections: granny squares, front and back panels, rainbow stripes, top edging, seams, strap, closure cord, tassels, and fringe.

The original design shows three granny squares across the front of the bag. To create matching front and back panels, make six granny squares in total—three for the front and three for the back.

Materials

You will need:

- **Worsted weight cotton yarn**
- **Beige yarn for the main color**
- **Hot pink yarn**
- **Orange yarn**
- **Yellow yarn**
- **Green yarn**
- **Turquoise yarn**
- **Lavender yarn**
- **US H/8 crochet hook, 5.0 mm**
- **Yarn needle**
- **Scissors**
- **Stitch markers**
- **Measuring tape**
- **A small piece of cardboard for making the tassels**
- **Optional fabric lining**
- **Optional magnetic snap or zipper**

Cotton yarn is recommended because it produces a firm, durable fabric that works well for bags. Acrylic yarn may also be used, but the finished bag may stretch more.

Finished Size

The finished bag should measure approximately:

- **Width: 12 inches or 30 cm**
- **Height: 10 inches or 25 cm**
- **Strap length: adjustable**
- **Fringe length: approximately 3 inches or 7.5 cm after trimming**

Your measurements may vary depending on your yarn, hook size, and personal tension.

Gauge

Exact gauge is not essential, but all six granny squares must be the same size.

A completed four-round granny square should measure approximately 4 inches or 10 cm across after light blocking.

When making the squares, compare them regularly. A small difference between squares can make the panels difficult to assemble evenly.

Crochet Abbreviations

- **ch: chain**
- **sl st: slip stitch**
- **sc: single crochet**
- **hdc: half double crochet**
- **dc: double crochet**
- **tr: treble crochet**
- **st: stitch**
- **sts: stitches**
- **sp: space**
- **sps: spaces**
- **rep: repeat**
- **rnd: round**

- **RS:** right side
- **WS:** wrong side
- **yo:** yarn over

A set of instructions inside parentheses should be worked into the same stitch or space.

Basic Crochet Methods Used

Chain Stitch

Make a slip knot and place it on the hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through the loop already on the hook.

Repeat this movement to make the required number of chains.

Slip Stitch

Insert the hook into the indicated stitch or space. Yarn over and pull through the stitch and the loop on the hook in one movement.

Slip stitches are used to join rounds without adding height.

Single Crochet

Insert the hook into the indicated stitch. Yarn over and pull up a loop. You should have two loops on the hook.

Yarn over and pull through both loops.

Half Double Crochet

Yarn over and insert the hook into the indicated stitch. Yarn over and pull up a loop. You should have three loops on the hook.

Yarn over and pull through all three loops.

Double Crochet

Yarn over and insert the hook into the indicated stitch. Yarn over and pull up a loop. You should have three loops on the hook.

Yarn over and pull through two loops. Yarn over again and pull through the remaining two loops.

Treble Crochet

Yarn over twice and insert the hook into the indicated stitch. Yarn over and pull up a loop.

Yarn over and pull through two loops three times until only one loop remains on the hook.

Step 1: Crochet the Granny Squares

Make six granny squares using the same color arrangement. Three squares will be joined for the front panel and three for the back panel.

Use the following suggested colors:

- Round 1: Hot Pink
- Round 2: Orange
- Round 3: Yellow
- Round 4: Beige

You may change the placement of the colors slightly, but using the same sequence for all six squares will create a balanced design.

Round 1

With Hot Pink, ch 4.

Join with a sl st in the first ch to form a ring.

Ch 3. The beginning ch 3 counts as the first dc.

Work 2 dc into the center of the ring, then ch 2.

Work the following sequence three times:

3 dc into the ring, ch 2.

Join with a sl st in the top of the beginning ch 3.

You should now have four groups of 3 dc and four ch-2 corner spaces.

Fasten off Hot Pink.

Round 2

Join Orange with a sl st in any ch-2 corner space.

Ch 3 and work 2 dc in the same corner space. Ch 2 and work 3 dc in the same space.

Ch 1.

In the next corner space, work:

3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc.

Ch 1.

Repeat the same corner sequence in each of the two remaining corner spaces.

Join with a sl st in the top of the beginning ch 3.

Fasten off Orange.

Round 3

Join Yellow in any ch-2 corner space.

Ch 3 and work 2 dc in the same corner space. Ch 2 and work 3 dc in the same space.

Ch 1.

Work 3 dc in the next ch-1 side space. Ch 1.

In the next corner space, work:

3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc.

Continue around, working 3 dc in every side ch-1 space and working 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in every corner.

Place ch 1 between each group of 3 dc.

Join with a sl st in the top of the beginning ch 3.

Fasten off Yellow.

Round 4

Join Beige in any corner space.

Ch 3 and work 2 dc in the same corner space. Ch 2 and work 3 dc in the same space.

Ch 1.

Work 3 dc in each ch-1 side space, placing ch 1 between the groups.

In each corner space, work:

3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc.

Continue around the entire square.

Join with a sl st in the top of the beginning ch 3.

Fasten off and weave in the ends.

Repeat these instructions until you have six matching squares.

Step 2: Block the Granny Squares

Blocking helps make the squares flat, even, and easier to join.

Gently wet each square or spray it lightly with water. Place it on a blocking mat or a folded towel.

Shape each square to approximately 4 inches by 4 inches. Make sure all four corners are square and all six pieces are the same size.

Pin the squares in place and allow them to dry completely.

Do not stretch them excessively. The goal is to straighten the edges, not enlarge the squares.

Step 3: Join the Granny Squares

Arrange three granny squares in a horizontal row for the front panel.

Arrange the other three squares in another horizontal row for the back panel.

Make sure all squares face the same direction.

With Beige, join the squares using single crochet seams.

Place the first two squares with their wrong sides together and their edges aligned. Insert the hook through both layers at the corner.

Join Beige and work sc evenly across the edge, passing the hook through the corresponding stitches of both squares.

Fasten off.

Join the third square to the second square in the same manner.

Repeat the complete joining process for the second set of three squares.

You should now have two rectangular strips, each containing three joined granny squares.

For flatter seams, the squares may be whip-stitched together with a yarn needle instead.

Step 4: Crochet the Beige Bottom Section

The beige section is worked along the bottom edge of each joined granny-square strip.

Lay one strip in front of you with the right side facing up.

Join Beige in the lower right corner.

Row 1

Ch 1. The ch 1 does not count as a stitch.

Work sc evenly across the entire bottom edge of the three joined squares.

Try to place the stitches evenly so the edge remains flat. Avoid adding too many stitches because this can create ruffling.

Turn.

Row 2

Ch 1.

Work 1 sc in every stitch across.

Turn.

Rows 3–6

Repeat Row 2.

After completing six rows, check the panel. The beige section should lie flat and should be the same width as the granny-square strip.

Fasten off.

Repeat the same instructions along the bottom of the second panel.

For a slightly deeper bag, add two or three additional rows of Beige to both panels.

Step 5: Crochet the Rainbow Stripes

The rainbow-striped section is worked along the top edge of each granny-square strip.

Begin at the upper right corner with the right side facing you.

Each color is used for one row. The six-color sequence is then repeated once for a total of twelve rows.

Row 1: Hot Pink

Join Hot Pink at the corner.

Ch 2. The beginning ch 2 does not count as a stitch.

Work 1 hdc evenly across the top edge.

Turn and fasten off.

Row 2: Orange

Join Orange in the first stitch.

Ch 2.

Work 1 hdc in every stitch across.

Turn and fasten off.

Row 3: Yellow

Join Yellow.

Ch 2.

Work 1 hdc in every stitch across.

Turn and fasten off.

Row 4: Green

Join Green.

Ch 2.

Work 1 hdc in every stitch across.

Turn and fasten off.

Row 5: Turquoise

Join Turquoise.

Ch 2.

Work 1 hdc in every stitch across.

Turn and fasten off.

Row 6: Lavender

Join Lavender.

Ch 2.

Work 1 hdc in every stitch across.

Turn and fasten off.

Rows 7–12

Repeat the complete color sequence:

- Row 7: Hot Pink
- Row 8: Orange
- Row 9: Yellow
- Row 10: Green
- Row 11: Turquoise
- Row 12: Lavender

Do not cut the yarn too close when changing colors. Leave tails long enough to weave in securely.

Repeat all twelve rainbow rows on the second panel.

Count the stitches after finishing each panel. The front and back panels must have the same number of stitches and the same finished width.

Step 6: Add the Top Edge

The top edge is worked in Beige to strengthen the bag opening.

Join Beige at the beginning of the last rainbow row.

Row 1

Ch 1.

Work 1 sc in every stitch across.

Turn.

Row 2

Ch 3. The beginning ch 3 counts as the first dc.

Work 1 dc in every remaining stitch across.

Turn.

Row 3

Ch 1.

Work 1 sc in every stitch across.

Turn.

Row 4

Ch 3.

Work 1 dc in every remaining stitch across.

Fasten off.

Repeat all four rows on the second panel.

Check that both bag panels are equal in width and height.

Step 7: Assemble the Front and Back Panels

Place the front and back panels together with the wrong sides facing each other. The right sides should face outward because the single crochet seam will become a visible decorative edge.

Match the granny squares, rainbow rows, and beige bottom rows carefully.

Use stitch markers to hold the panels together at the corners and along the sides.

Join Beige at the upper corner of one side.

Ch 1 and work sc evenly down the first side, passing the hook through both layers.

Place additional stitches around the lower corner so the fabric does not pull.

Continue working sc across the bottom edge.

Work additional stitches around the second lower corner, then continue upward along the other side.

Stop at the opposite upper corner.

Fasten off securely.

Do not crochet across the top opening.

Turn the bag gently and inspect the seams. The bag should sit evenly without twisting.

For a less visible seam, place the panels with right sides together, sew the sides and bottom, and then turn the bag right side out.

Step 8: Crochet the Shoulder Strap

The strap is worked in Beige.

Ch 120, or make a chain long enough to create your preferred strap length.

A chain of 120 stitches with worsted weight yarn and a 5.0 mm hook usually produces a medium-length shoulder strap. For a crossbody bag, add more chains.

Before continuing, hold the chain against the bag and test the approximate length.

Strap Row 1

Work 1 sc in the second ch from the hook.

Work 1 sc in every remaining ch across.

Turn.

Strap Row 2

Ch 1.

Work 1 sc in every stitch across.

Turn.

Rows 3–6

Repeat Row 2.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

The completed strap should be approximately 1 to 1½ inches wide.

For a stronger strap, add two more rows or place a strip of cotton webbing or fabric ribbon inside the crocheted strap.

Step 9: Attach the Strap

Place one end of the strap inside the bag near the first side seam.

The strap should overlap the inside of the bag by approximately 2 inches.

Use Beige yarn and a yarn needle to sew the strap securely to the bag.

Sew a square around the edge of the overlapping section. Then sew diagonally across the square to form an X.

Repeat on the opposite side with the second strap end.

Before finishing the second attachment, make sure the strap is not twisted.

Pull firmly on both ends to test the seam. Add more stitches when necessary. Bag straps carry significant weight and should be attached very securely.

Step 10: Crochet the Tassel Closure Cord

With Beige, ch 60 or make a chain long enough to reach around the bag opening and tie comfortably at the front.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail at each end.

Thread the chain through the spaces in the top Beige edging. Begin near the center front of the bag.

Pass the chain over and under the stitches around the opening, finishing at the center front.

Adjust the cord so both ends are equal.

The cord should slide easily enough to draw the opening slightly closed.

Step 11: Make Two Large Tassels

Cut a piece of cardboard approximately 4 inches high.

Wrap the rainbow yarn around the cardboard approximately 60 to 70 times.

You can use one color at a time or hold several colors together while wrapping. For the multicolored appearance shown in the design, alternate Hot Pink, Orange, Yellow, Green, Turquoise, Lavender, and Beige.

Cut a separate piece of strong yarn approximately 12 inches long.

Slide this yarn under the wrapped strands at the top of the cardboard. Tie it tightly with a double knot.

Carefully slide the bundle off the cardboard.

Cut through all the loops at the bottom.

Cut another piece of yarn approximately 18 inches long.

Wrap this piece firmly around the tassel approximately 1 inch below the top. Wrap it several times and tie it securely.

Thread the ends into the wrapped section with a yarn needle.

Trim the bottom of the tassel until all strands are even.

Repeat to make a second matching tassel.

Step 12: Attach the Tassels to the Closure Cord

Use the long tie at the top of the first tassel to attach it securely to one end of the closure cord.

Pass the tie through the final chain and knot it several times.

Use a yarn needle to hide the ends inside the tassel head.

Attach the second tassel to the other end of the cord in the same manner.

Trim both tassels so they are approximately the same length.

Step 13: Add the Bottom Fringe

Cut multiple strands of yarn approximately 6 inches long.

Use all the rainbow colors and Beige. The strands will be folded in half, producing fringe approximately 3 inches long.

Use two or three strands for each fringe group.

Fold one group of strands in half.

Insert the crochet hook through a stitch or space along the bottom edge of the bag.

Use the hook to pull the folded center of the strands partway through the edge, creating a loop.

Pass all loose ends through the loop.

Pull gently but firmly to tighten the fringe.

Continue attaching fringe groups evenly across the entire bottom edge.

Alternate the colors in a repeating sequence:

- **Hot Pink**
- **Orange**
- **Yellow**
- **Green**
- **Turquoise**
- **Lavender**
- **Beige**

You may place a fringe group in every stitch for a very full edge or in every second stitch for a lighter appearance.

When all fringe has been attached, place the bag on a flat surface and trim the ends evenly.

Step 14: Weave In All Yarn Ends

Thread each loose yarn end onto a yarn needle.

Weave the end through the back of several stitches. Change direction and weave through several more stitches.

Trim the remaining yarn close to the fabric.

Do not simply cut the yarn near a knot. Crochet pieces receive movement and pressure, and unsecured ends may come loose.

Pay particular attention to the color changes in the rainbow section and to the ends near the strap attachments.

Step 15: Block the Finished Bag

Lightly dampen the bag without soaking it.

Shape the granny squares, straighten the rainbow rows, and arrange the side seams evenly.

Place a folded towel inside the bag to help it maintain its shape.

Allow the bag to dry completely on a flat surface.

Keep the tassels and fringe straight while drying. Comb the fringe gently with your fingers before trimming any uneven strands.

Step 16: Add an Optional Fabric Lining

A lining is optional, but it prevents small objects from passing through the crochet openings and helps the bag retain its shape.

Measure the width and height of the finished bag.

Cut two rectangles of cotton fabric approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ inch wider on every side than the interior measurements.

Place the fabric rectangles with their right sides together.

Sew along both sides and the bottom, leaving the top open.

Fold the upper raw edge toward the wrong side by approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ inch and press it.

Place the lining inside the bag with the wrong side of the fabric facing the crochet.

Position the folded upper edge slightly below the crocheted opening.

Hand-sew the lining to the inside of the bag using small stitches. Do not pull the thread too tightly because this may distort the crochet.

A magnetic snap or zipper may be installed in the lining before it is sewn into the bag.

Step 17: Final Inspection and Adjustments

Place the bag upright and check that both sides are even.

Make sure the strap lies flat and is firmly attached.

Pull the closure cord to confirm that it moves smoothly.

Check that the tassels are securely tied and that the fringe is evenly spaced.

Trim any uneven fringe strands.

Inspect the inside and outside of the bag for loose yarn ends.

The completed bag should have:

- Three granny squares across the front
- Three granny squares across the back
- A beige lower section
- Two complete sets of rainbow stripes
- A reinforced Beige opening
- A long Beige shoulder strap
- Two colorful closure tassels
- Multicolored fringe along the bottom

Helpful Tips

Use firm, even stitches to create a sturdy bag. Loose crochet can cause the finished project to stretch.

Block all six granny squares before joining them. Even squares produce straighter panels and cleaner seams.

Count the stitches on the front and back panels after every major section. Both panels must remain identical.

When working along the edges of the granny squares, distribute the stitches evenly rather than forcing a specific number into each row end.

Reinforce the strap attachments with several passes of yarn.

Customize the strap length before sewing it permanently to the bag.

The rainbow colors may be replaced with any palette, but using Beige as the main color creates the warm boho appearance shown in the original design.
