

APPLIQUÉ WATERING CAN WITH FLOWERS

QUILT BLOCK TUTORIAL



FINISHED BLOCK SIZE
25.0 cm x 25.0 cm

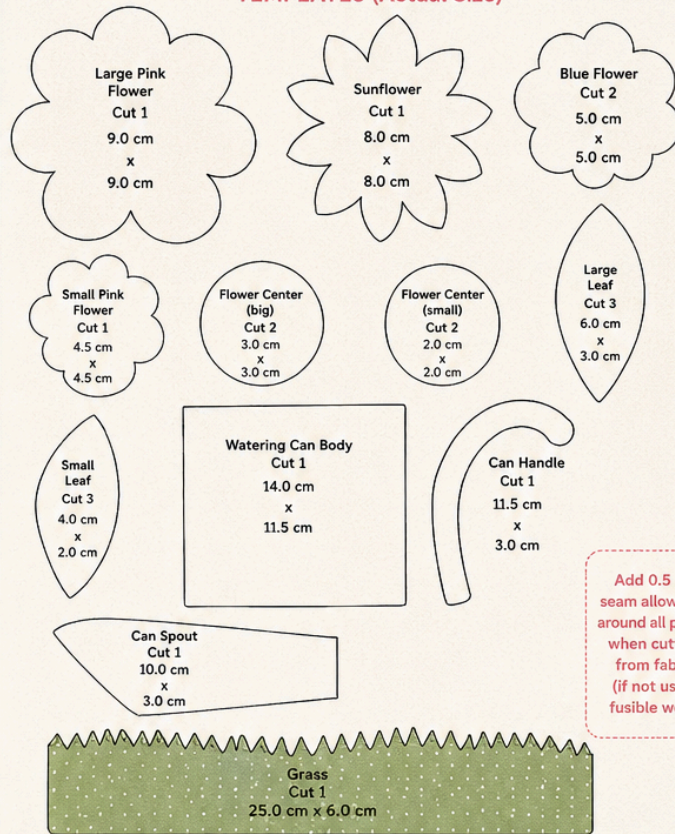
FABRICS

- Background (solid or tone-on-tone)
30.0 cm x 30.0 cm
- Watering Can (blue)
20.0 cm x 20.0 cm
- Grass (green)
- Flowers (assorted) scraps
- Leaves (green) scraps
- Centers (yellow/black) scraps

MATERIALS

- 100% cotton fabric
- Fusible web (lightweight)
- Threads to match fabrics
- Needle for hand applique
- Scissors / Fabric scissors
- Fabric marker
- Iron and ironing board
- Pins
- Quilting batting (28.0 cm x 28.0 cm)
- Backing fabric (28.0 cm x 28.0 cm)

TEMPLATES (Actual Size)



Add 0.5 cm seam allowance around all pieces when cutting from fabric (if not using fusible web).

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS

1 PREPARE YOUR FABRICS

- Wash, dry, and iron all fabrics.
- Trace templates on the paper side of fusible web and cut them out roughly.



2 FUSE APPLIQUÉ PIECES

- Fuse the rough fusible web pieces to the wrong side of fabrics.
- Cut out precisely on the drawn lines.



3 ARRANGE THE DESIGN

- Place all pieces on the background fabric.
- Arrange until you are happy with the layout.
- Keep 0.3–0.5 cm between pieces.



4 APPLIQUÉ THE PIECES

- Use one of the methods below:
 - Hand Appliqué (recommended): Use a small slip stitch or blanket stitch.
 - Machine Appliqué: Use a zigzag stitch around edges.



5 ADD DETAILS

- Stitch flower centers using small stitches.
- Add veins on leaves with backstitch (optional).
- Add French knots to blue flowers if desired.



6 SEW THE GRASS

- Place the grass at the bottom.
- Appliqué with hand or machine.
- You can add small straight stitches on top of grass for texture.



7 QUILT THE BLOCK

- Layer quilt top, batting, and backing.
- Baste (pin or spray baste).
- Quilt around the design or with straight lines.



8 SQUARE AND BIND

- Trim the block to 25.0 cm x 25.0 cm.
- Prepare binding strips 2.5 cm wide.
- Bind using your favorite method.



9 FINISHED!

- Your beautiful appliqué watering can block is ready to be used in quilts, cushions, bags, or wall hangings!



MAIN STITCHES USED

- Appliqué (Hand) Slip Stitch
- Blanket Stitch
- Backstitch
- French Knot
- Straight Stitch



QUILTING IDEAS

- Outline the watering can.
- Echo around flowers.
- Add straight lines in the background.
- Add small pebbles or swirls.



TIPS

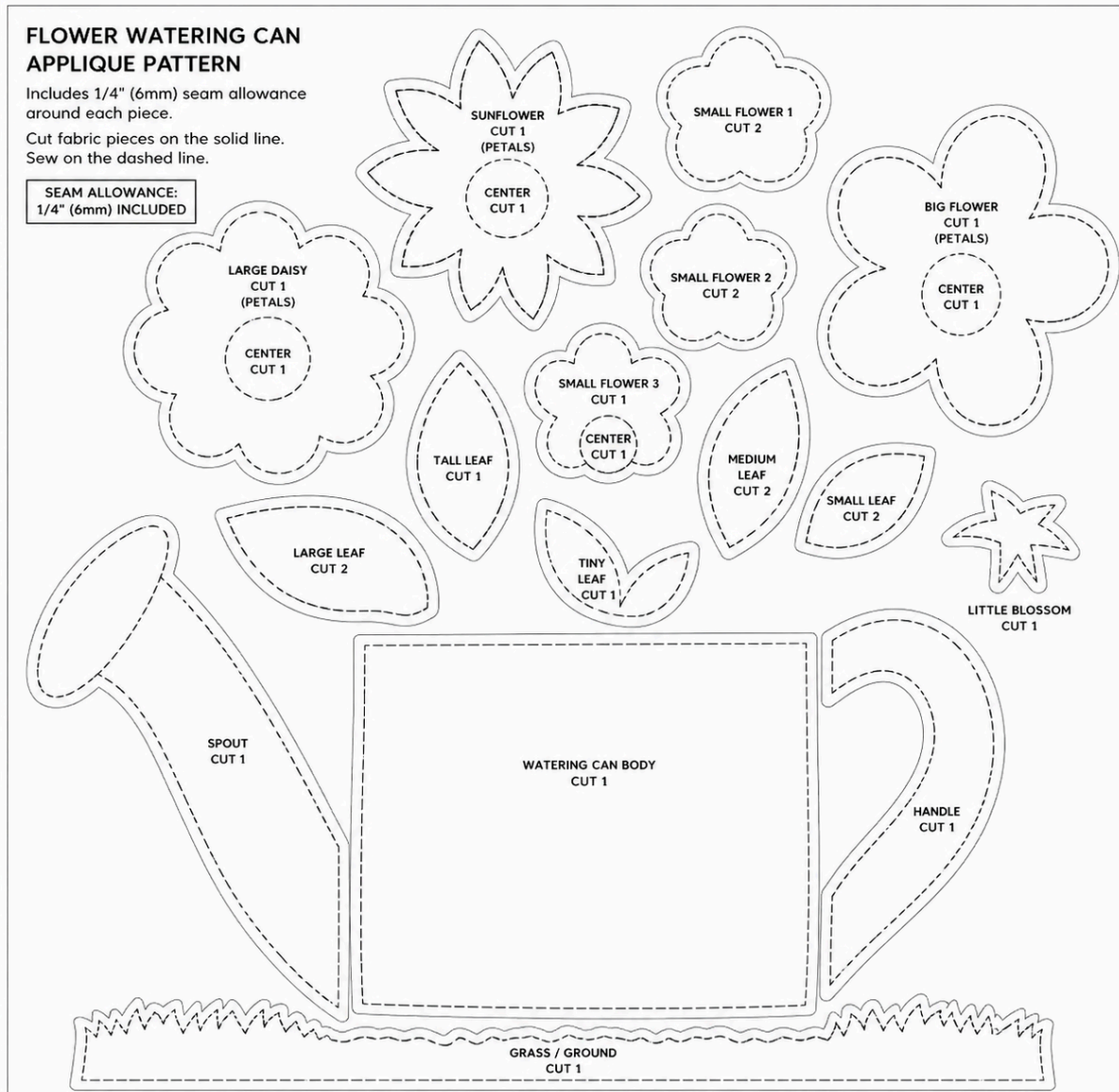
- Use contrasting thread for a beautiful hand-stitched look.
- Press each piece before appliqué.
- Take your time and enjoy the process!



CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- Hand wash or gentle machine wash
- Use mild detergent
- Do not bleach
- Line dry
- Warm iron if needed

Apply Watering Can With Flowers Quilt Block Tutorial



This tutorial makes a 25 cm x 25 cm finished quilt block featuring a fabric watering can, flowers, leaves, grass, and hand-stitched details. Add 0.5 cm seam allowance around all pieces when cutting fabric unless using fusible web.

Materials

You will need 100% cotton fabric, lightweight fusible web, matching threads, appliqué needle, fabric scissors, fabric marker, pins, iron, quilting batting, and backing fabric.

You also need background fabric 30 x 30 cm, blue watering can fabric 20 x 20 cm, green grass fabric, assorted flower scraps, green leaf scraps, and yellow/black scraps for flower centers.

Template Cutting Guide

Cut the watering can body: 1 piece, 14 cm x 11.5 cm.

Cut the can spout: 1 piece, 10 cm x 3 cm.

Cut the can handle: 1 piece, 11.5 cm x 3 cm.

Cut the grass: 1 piece, 25 cm x 6 cm.

Cut the large pink flower: 1 piece, 9 cm x 9 cm.

Cut the small pink flower: 1 piece, 4.5 cm x 4.5 cm.

Cut the sunflower: 1 piece, 8 cm x 8 cm.

Cut the blue flower: 2 pieces, 5 cm x 5 cm.

Cut large leaves: 3 pieces, 6 cm x 3 cm.

Cut small leaves: 3 pieces, 4 cm x 2 cm.

Cut large flower centers: 2 pieces, 3 cm x 3 cm.

Cut small flower centers: 2 pieces, 2 cm x 2 cm.

Prepare Your Fabrics

Wash, dry, and iron all fabrics before starting.

Trace each template onto the paper side of the fusible web.

Cut the traced shapes roughly, leaving a small margin around each piece.

Fuse the rough-cut templates to the wrong side of the matching fabrics.

Fuse and Cut the Applique Pieces

Press each fusible web piece onto the fabric using your iron.

Let the fabric cool before cutting.

Cut each appliqué shape carefully on the drawn lines.

Remove the paper backing from each piece.

Arrange the Design

Place the background fabric flat on your table.

Position the grass at the bottom.

Place the watering can body above the grass, then add the spout and handle.

Arrange the flower stems, leaves, flowers, and centers until the layout looks balanced.

Keep about 0.3–0.5 cm spacing between pieces where needed.

Fuse the Design

When you are happy with the layout, press the appliqué pieces in place.

Use a pressing cloth if needed to protect the fabric.

Make sure all edges are attached before stitching.

Apply the Pieces

Use hand appliqué with a small slip stitch or blanket stitch.

For machine appliqué, use a zigzag stitch around the edges.

Stitch slowly around curves, petals, leaves, and the watering can.

Use matching or contrasting thread depending on the look you want.

Add Details

Stitch flower centers using small stitches.

Add leaf veins with backstitch.

Add French knots to the blue flowers if desired.

Use straight stitches for flower stems.

You can also add small stitches on top of the grass for texture.

Sew the Grass

Place the grass piece at the bottom of the block.

Appliqué it by hand or machine.

Add small straight stitches across the grass to create movement and texture.

Quilt the Block

Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing fabric.

Baste with pins or spray baste.

Quilt around the watering can, flowers, leaves, and grass.

You can echo quilt around the flowers or add small pebbles and swirls in the background.

Square and Bind

Trim the block to 25 cm x 25 cm.

Prepare binding strips about 2.5 cm wide.

Bind the edges using your favorite quilting method.

Press the finished block neatly.

Care Instructions

Hand wash or gentle machine wash.

Use mild detergent.

Do not bleach.

Line dry.

Warm iron if needed.

Finished Project Ideas

Use this appliqué block for quilts, cushions, wall hangings, tote bags, table mats, or handmade gifts.
