

CROCHET FLOWER HEADSCARF

Step-by-Step Tutorial

♥ A beautiful, lacy headscarf with delicate crochet flowers! ♥



- MATERIALS**
- Yarn: Worsted weight (4)
 - Main color (MC): Lavender
 - Flowers: Pink, White, Yellow, Purple
 - Leaves: Green
 - Crochet hook: 4.0 mm (G/6)
 - Yarn needle
 - Scissors

- ABBREVIATIONS (US TERMS)**
- ch – chain
 - sl st – slip stitch
 - sc – single crochet
 - dc – double crochet
 - hdc – half double crochet
 - tr – treble crochet
 - sp – space
 - st(s) – stitch(es)
 - MC – main color

- FINISHED SIZE**
- One size fits most.
 - The bandana is adjustable.
 - Shown: medium size.

1. OVERVIEW

This headscarf is worked from the top (center back) downward in a triangle using a lacy mesh stitch. Then, crochet the leaf chain and flowers around the edge.



2. HEADSCARF – LACY TRIANGLE

Step 1: Starting Point
Ch 3, sl st in the first ch to form a ring.



Step 2: Row 1
Ch 5, (counts as dc, ch 2). Work 2 dc in the ring.



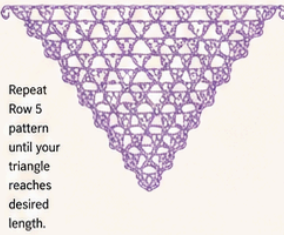
Step 3: Row 2
Ch 5, turn. Work 1 dc in the first dc, ch 2, 2 dc in the ch-2 sp.



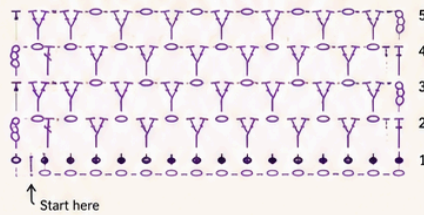
Step 4: Row 3
Ch 5, turn. Dc in next dc, ch 2, dc in next 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp.



Step 5: Continue
Repeat this pattern, increasing at each end every row: dc, ch 2, dc ...until the triangle reaches your desired length.



LACY STITCH PATTERN (Repeat Rows 2-5)



KEY

- = chain (ch)
- = slip stitch (sl st)
- | = single crochet (sc)
- ┆ = double crochet (dc)
- ┆┆ = treble crochet (tr)

TIPS

- Try it on as you go to get the perfect length.
- The lacy mesh makes it light and breathable.
- Block gently if needed.

3. FLOWER EDGING

Step 1: Attach Yarn
Join green yarn with sl st in any corner stitch at the bottom edge.



Step 2: Leaf Chain
Ch 4, skip 2 stitches, sl st in next stitch. Repeat around the entire edge.



Step 3: Flower Center
Join flower color in the center of a leaf with sl st. Ch 2, work 6 sc in the same space.



Step 4: Flower Petals
(Change to petal color)
Ch 2, sl st in next stitch
Repeat from * to * 5 more times. (6 petals total)



Step 5: Repeat
Make flowers in different colors around the edge.



Flower Example (6 petals)

- Round 1 (center): Ch 2, 6 sc in ring.
- Round 2 (petals): *Ch 2, sl st in next st* Repeat 6 times. Fasten off and weave in ends.



4. FINISHING

- Weave in all ends with a yarn needle.
- Block the headscarf gently to open up the lace.
- Your crochet flower headscarf is ready to wear!



CROCHET BASICS – US TERMS

STITCH	SYMBOL	HOW TO	DESCRIPTION
Chain (ch)	○		Yarn over, pull through loop.
Slip Stitch (sl st)	●		Insert hook, yarn over, pull through both loops.
Single Crochet (sc)			Insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.
Half Double Crochet (hdc)	┆		Yarn over, insert hook, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through all 3 loops.
Double Crochet (dc)	┆┆		Yarn over, insert hook, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 2 loops.
Treble Crochet (tr)	┆┆┆		Yarn over twice, insert hook, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 2 loops.

PATTERN DIAGRAM & STITCH GUIDE



STITCH KEY (US TERMS)

- Chain (ch)
- Slip stitch (sl st)
- | Single crochet (sc)
- ⏏ Half double crochet (hdc)
- ⏏ Double crochet (dc)
- ⏏ Treble crochet (tr)
- Magic ring (mr)

MATERIALS

- Sport or DK weight cotton yarn
- 2.5 mm – 3.5 mm (US B/1 – E/4) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors

EDGING ASSEMBLY

1. Along the lower edge of the headscarf, attach yarn with a sl st.
2. Ch 3, sc in next space, ch 6 (leaf), sc in next space.
3. Repeat: attach flower, add leaf between flowers as shown in diagram.
4. Fasten off and weave in all ends.

HEADSCARF (MAIN MESH)

The headscarf is worked from the top center down in rows. Use the diagram above as a guide.

- **Foundation:** ch 5
 - **Row 1:** dc in 4th ch from hook, ch 2, dc in same ch, ch 2, skip 2 ch, dc in next ch, ch 2, dc in same ch. (2 mesh spaces made)
 - **Row 2 and beyond:** Continue in mesh pattern (dc, ch 2, dc) in each mesh space, increasing at the sides as shown in chart, until desired size.
- Fasten off.

FLOWER (MAKE 7)



Round 1 (center):
mr, 12 sc, sl st to join.

Round 2 (petals):
(ch 2, dc, ch 2, sl st) in same stitch, repeat 12 times.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

LEAF (MAKE 14)



ch 6,
sc in 2nd ch from hook,
hdc, dc, hdc,
sc, sl st.
Fasten off.

FINISHED SIZE (APPROX.)

One size fits most.
Adjust by adding more rows for a longer scarf.



ABBREVIATIONS (US TERMS)

ch = chain
sl st = slip stitch
sc = single crochet
hdc = half double crochet
dc = double crochet
tr = treble crochet
mr = magic ring
() = repeat instructions

Crochet Flower Headscarf – Complete Step-by-Step Tutorial

Create a beautiful Crochet Flower Headscarf with this complete beginner-friendly tutorial. This project features a lightweight lacy triangle bandana decorated with delicate crochet flowers and leafy vines. Materials

Before you begin, gather all of your supplies.

Yarn

- **Worsted Weight (Category 4) yarn**
- **Main Color (MC): Lavender**
- **Flower Colors:**
 - **Pink**
 - **White**
 - **Yellow**
 - **Purple**
- **Leaf Color:**
 - **Green**

Tools

- **4.0 mm (G/6) crochet hook**
- **Yarn needle**
- **Scissors**
- **Stitch markers (optional but recommended)**
- **Measuring tape**

Crochet Abbreviations (US Terms)

- **ch – chain**
- **sl st – slip stitch**
- **sc – single crochet**
- **hdc – half double crochet**
- **dc – double crochet**
- **tr – treble crochet**
- **sp – space**
- **st – stitch**
- **MC – Main Color**

Finished Size

This headscarf is designed as one size fits most adults.

The finished triangle can easily be adjusted by adding or removing rows before beginning the edging.

Approximate size:

- **Width: 26–30 inches**
- **Height: 13–16 inches**

Before You Begin

This project is worked:

- **From the top center downward**
- **In rows**
- **Increasing on every row**
- **Creating an open lace mesh**
- **Finished with a decorative floral border**

Always count your stitches carefully at the end of each row to keep the triangle symmetrical.

H2 Step 1 – Create the Starting Ring

Begin with the lavender yarn.

Make:

- **Chain 3.**
- **Join with a slip stitch into the first chain to create a small ring.**

This ring becomes the very top center of your headscarf.

Do not twist the chain before joining.

H2 Step 2 – Crochet Row 1

Work directly into the ring.

Instructions:

- **Chain 5.**
 - **The first 3 chains count as one double crochet.**
 - **The remaining 2 chains create the center space.**
- **Work 2 double crochet into the ring.**

Your first row now consists of:

- **DC**
- **Chain-2 space**
- **2 DC**

This forms the tiny triangle that all future rows will build upon.

Turn your work.

H2 Step 3 – Crochet Row 2

Begin increasing.

Work:

- **Chain 5.**
- **Turn.**
- **Make 1 double crochet in the first stitch.**
- **Chain 2.**
- **Work 2 double crochet into the center chain-2 space.**
- **Chain 2.**
- **Work 2 double crochet into the final stitch.**

You will now notice the triangle beginning to widen.

Turn.

H2 Step 4 – Crochet Row 3

Continue building the lace pattern.

Instructions:

- **Chain 5.**
- **Turn.**
- **Work one double crochet in the next stitch.**
- **Chain 2.**
- **Work one double crochet in the next stitch.**
- **Chain 2.**

- Work two double crochet in the center space.
- Chain 2.
- Work one double crochet in the next stitch.
- Chain 2.
- Finish with two double crochet in the final stitch.

Your lace mesh should now begin to resemble open diamonds.

H2 Step 5 – Continue the Lace Triangle

Repeat the same increase pattern for every row.

General Rule:

- Begin each row with Chain 5.
- Work double crochet groups separated by chain-2 spaces.
- Increase at both edges.
- Work two double crochet into the center space every row.

Continue until your triangle reaches the desired size.

Most adult headscarves require approximately 22–28 rows, depending on your tension.

Try the scarf on occasionally.

The lower point should reach approximately the middle of your upper back.

H2 Understanding the Lace Pattern

The lace pattern is very repetitive, making it relaxing to crochet.

Each new row:

- **Starts with edge increases.**
- **Builds around the previous row's chain spaces.**
- **Adds another open section.**
- **Ends with matching increases.**

Always crochet into the chain spaces instead of forcing stitches into tight stitch tops whenever appropriate.

This keeps the lace open and airy.

H2 Step 6 – Prepare for the Flower Border

Once your triangle reaches the desired size:

Do not fasten off.

Switch to green yarn.

Join the green yarn using a slip stitch at one bottom corner.

You will now crochet the leafy vine all around the lower edge.

H2 Step 7 – Crochet the Leaf Vine

The leafy vine forms the base for attaching the flowers.

Repeat around the lower edge:

- **Chain 4.**
- **Slip stitch into the next suitable stitch.**
- **Repeat.**

Continue making small chain loops evenly across the edge.

Try to keep equal spacing.

The vine should lay flat without pulling.

H2 Step 8 – Crochet the Leaves

Into selected chain loops, crochet the leaves.

Basic Leaf:

- **Chain 4.**
- **Slip stitch into the second chain from hook.**
- **Slip stitch into the next stitch.**
- **Slip stitch into the final stitch.**
- **Join back to the vine.**

Repeat every few chain loops.

Vary the placement naturally.

The finished vine should resemble climbing greenery.

H2 Step 9 – Crochet the Flower Centers

Make each flower separately.

Using the desired flower color:

Create a magic ring (or chain 2 and work into the first chain).

Round 1:

- **Chain 2.**

- Work 6 single crochet into the ring.
- Join with a slip stitch.

Pull the ring tight.

Fasten securely.

H2 Step 10 – Crochet the Flower Petals

Join the petal color.

Repeat the following 6 times:

- Chain 2.
- Slip stitch into the next stitch.
- Repeat around.

Each repeat creates one rounded petal.

After six petals:

Join with a slip stitch.

Fasten off.

Leave a long tail for sewing.

H2 Step 11 – Make Additional Flowers

Create flowers in several colors for a natural appearance.

Suggested color combination:

 **Pink**

 **White**

🟡 Yellow

💜 Lavender

Alternate flower sizes slightly by:

- Using tighter tension
- Using looser tension
- Changing hook size slightly if desired

This creates a more organic look.

H2 Step 12 – Attach the Flowers

Arrange the flowers before sewing.

Do not sew immediately.

Lay the scarf flat.

Space the flowers evenly across the leafy vine.

Mix colors randomly.

Attach each flower using the yarn needle.

Secure every flower firmly on the back.

H2 Step 13 – Weave in All Ends

Turn the headscarf over.

Using the yarn needle:

- Weave every yarn tail through several stitches.
- Change directions once or twice.

- Trim excess yarn.

Avoid cutting too close to the work.

H2 Step 14 – Block the Headscarf

Blocking dramatically improves the lace.

Lightly dampen the scarf.

Pin it into a perfect triangle.

Open all lace spaces evenly.

Allow it to dry completely.

Blocking helps:

- Even out stitches
- Improve drape
- Open the lace design
- Make the flowers sit beautifully

H2 Step 15 – Final Inspection









Before wearing:

- ✓ Check every flower is secure.
- ✓ Trim loose ends.
- ✓ Confirm the triangle is symmetrical.
- ✓ Ensure the edging lies flat.
- ✓ Verify that all leaves are attached securely.

H2 Styling Ideas

This elegant crochet flower headscarf can be worn in many ways.

Perfect for:

-  Cottagecore outfits
-  Spring fashion
-  Summer festivals
-  Beach vacations
-  Everyday casual wear
-  Handmade gifts
-  Mother's Day presents
-  Bridal showers

It pairs beautifully with dresses, denim jackets, linen outfits, and boho-inspired clothing.

H2 Care Instructions









To keep your headscarf looking beautiful:

- Hand wash in cool water.
- Use mild detergent.
- Do not wring.

- Lay flat to dry.
- Store folded rather than hanging.
- Avoid excessive heat.

Proper care will keep the flowers vibrant and the lace looking fresh for years.

H2 Helpful Tips for Success

-  Keep your tension consistent throughout the project.
-  Count your stitches after every row.
-  Block the finished scarf for the best appearance.
-  Use stitch markers if you're new to lace crochet.
-  Arrange the flowers before sewing to achieve a balanced design.
-  Make extra flowers if you'd like a fuller floral border.
-  Choose soft cotton or acrylic yarn for comfort and durability.
-  Take your time with the edging—the flowers are what make this project truly special.
