

PEAR POCKET ORGANIZER

STEP-BY-STEP SEWING TUTORIAL

A charming practical hanging organizer for your kitchen!



FINISHED SIZE

Height: 34 cm
Width: 24 cm



MATERIALS

- Main fabric (green print): 35 cm x 40 cm
- Pocket fabric (plaid): 25 cm x 30 cm
- Lining fabric: 35 cm x 40 cm
- Fusible interfacing (medium weight): 35 cm x 40 cm
- Bias binding: 250 cm (or make your own)
- Felt or fabric for leaf (green): 10 cm x 6 cm
- Felt or fabric for stem (brown): 8 cm x 3 cm
- Button: 1 (2–2.5 cm diameter)
- Matching thread
- Sewing machine and basic sewing tools
- Fabric glue (optional)

FABRIC GUIDE (US)

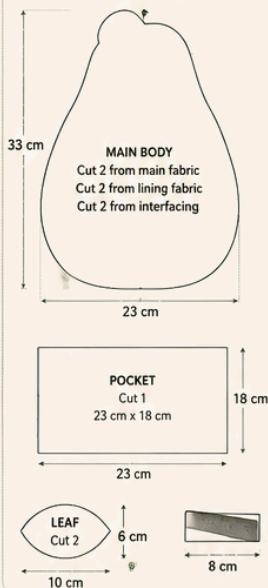
- Main fabric: Quilting Cotton
- Pocket fabric: Quilting Cotton
- Lining: Quilting Cotton
- Interfacing: Pellon® SF101 Shape-Flex
- Felt (leaf & stem): Wool or Acrylic Felt

MAIN SEWING METHODS

- Seam allowance: 0.7 cm
- Straight stitch
- Topstitch
- Appliqué
- Turning
- Edge binding

PATTERN PIECES

(Add 0.7 cm seam allowance)



STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS



FROM START TO FINISH



TIPS

- Use a walking foot for thick layers.
- Press seams for a professional finish.
- You can hang it on a wall hook or cabinet knob.

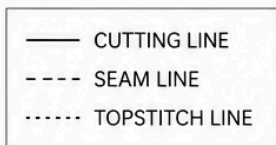

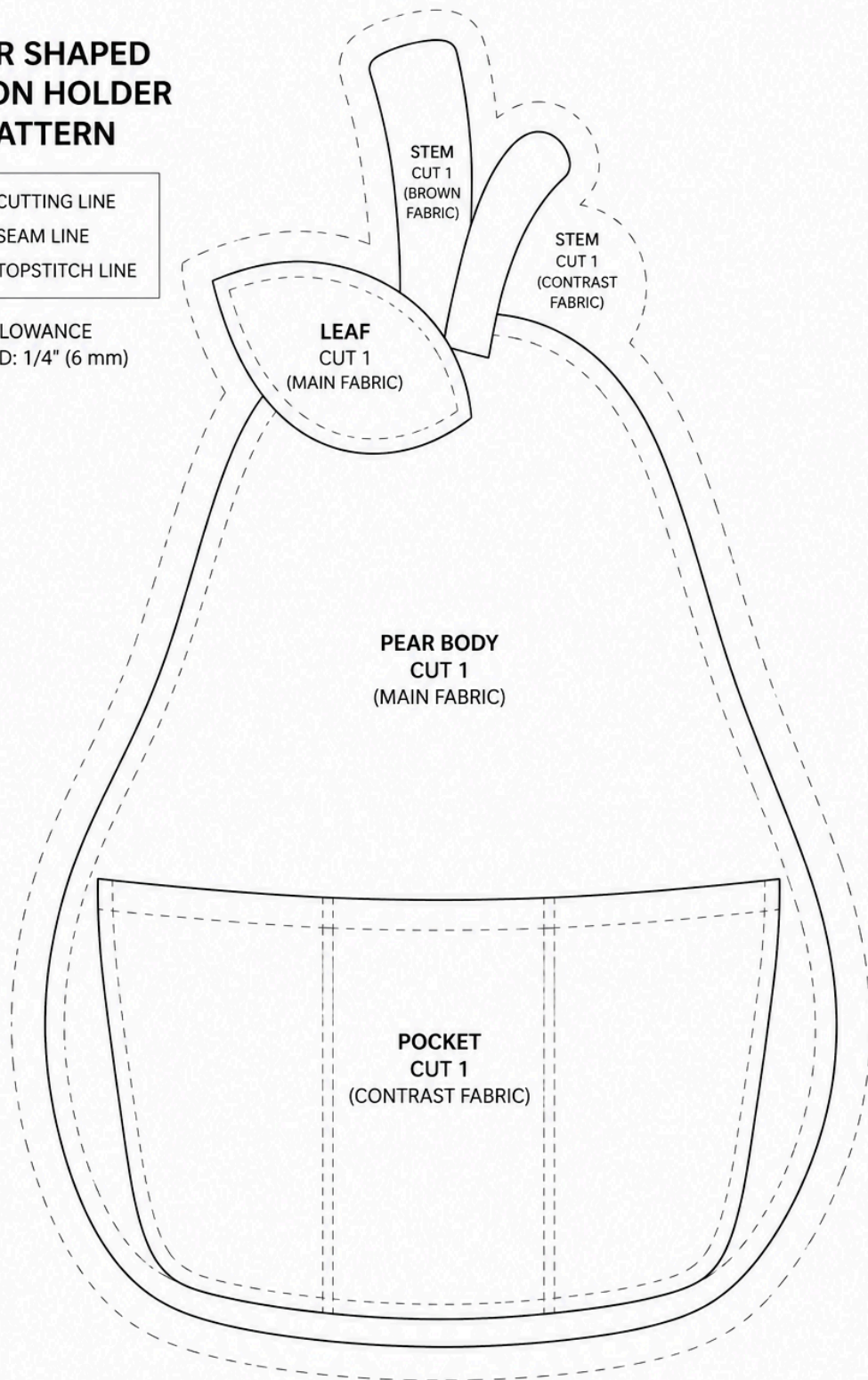

STEM CUT 1 (BROWN FABRIC)

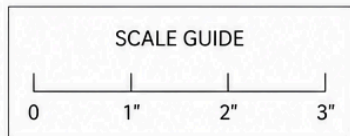
STEM CUT 1 (CONTRAST FABRIC)

Pear Pocket Organizer – Complete Step-by-Step Sewing Tutorial

🍏 Create a beautiful and practical Pear Pocket Organizer that brings charm and functionality to your kitchen, craft room, or entryway. This beginner-friendly sewing project combines quilting cotton, simple sewing techniques, and basic appliqué to create a hanging organizer with multiple front pockets for wooden spoons, utensils, scissors, craft tools, or other everyday essentials.

This tutorial follows the measurements, construction order, and materials shown in the original project while expanding every step into a detailed guide. Even if you're new to sewing, you can confidently complete this organizer from start to finish.

The finished organizer measures approximately:

- Height: 34 cm (13³/₈")
- Width: 24 cm (9¹/₂")

🧵 Materials and Supplies

Prepare all materials before beginning.

Fabrics

Main Fabric (Pear Body)

- Quilting cotton
- Cut size: 35 × 40 cm

Pocket Fabric

- **Quilting cotton (plaid or coordinating print)**
- **Cut size: 25 × 30 cm**

Lining Fabric

- **Quilting cotton**
- **Cut size: 35 × 40 cm**

Stabilizer

- **Medium-weight fusible interfacing**
- **Cut size: 35 × 40 cm**

Additional Materials

- **Bias binding (approximately 250 cm / 98 inches)**
- **Green felt or fabric for the leaf**
- **Brown felt or fabric for the stem**
- **One decorative button (2–2.5 cm / $\frac{3}{4}$ –1 inch)**
- **Matching sewing thread**
- **Fabric scissors**
- **Rotary cutter (optional)**
- **Cutting mat**
- **Pins or sewing clips**
- **Fabric marker**
- **Iron**
- **Ironing board**
- **Sewing machine**
- **Hand sewing needle (optional)**
- **Fabric glue (optional)**



Pattern Pieces

Add a 0.7 cm (1/4") seam allowance around all pattern pieces if your template does not already include it.

Main Body

Cut:

- **2 from main fabric**
- **2 from lining fabric**
- **2 from fusible interfacing**

Finished body pattern size:

- **Height: 33 cm**
- **Width: 23 cm**

Pocket

Cut:

- **1 rectangle**

Size:

23 × 18 cm

Leaf

Cut:

- **2 pieces**

Approximate size:

10 × 6 cm

Stem

Cut:

- 1 piece

Approximate size:

8 × 3 cm

Step 1 – Prepare All Pieces

Carefully transfer every pattern onto the fabrics.

Cut:

- Two pear-shaped main body pieces
- Two lining pieces
- Two interfacing pieces
- One pocket rectangle
- Two leaf pieces
- One stem piece

Before moving on, organize the pieces into separate piles.

Taking a few minutes now will make sewing much easier later.

Step 2 – Apply Fusible Interfacing

Place the rough adhesive side of the interfacing against the wrong side of each main body fabric piece.

Using a hot iron without steam:

- Press for 10–15 seconds.
- Lift the iron instead of sliding it.

- **Cover the entire surface.**

Allow the fabric to cool completely before moving it.

The interfacing gives the organizer enough structure to hang properly while supporting the weight of utensils.

Step 3 – Make the Front Pocket

Take the 23 × 18 cm pocket rectangle.

Fold the top edge toward the wrong side approximately 1 cm ($\frac{3}{8}$ ").

Press well.

Fold again to hide the raw edge.

Press once more.

Topstitch close to the folded edge using a straight stitch.

This creates a clean, professional pocket opening.

Step 4 – Attach the Pocket

Center the pocket on the lower portion of the pear front.

Pin or clip it securely.

Sew:

- **Left side**
- **Bottom**
- **Right side**

Leave the top open.

Now divide the pocket into three sections.

Measure evenly across the width.

Pin the dividing lines.

Sew straight vertical lines from the top of the pocket to the bottom.

Backstitch at both ends.

Your organizer now has three separate storage compartments.

Step 5 – Sew the Leaf

Place both leaf pieces with right sides together.

Stitch all around the edge.

Leave a small opening for turning.

Trim the seam allowance.

Clip around curves carefully.

Turn the leaf right side out.

Use a blunt turning tool to shape the tip.

Press flat.

Topstitch close to the edge.

This keeps the leaf flat while adding a decorative finish.

Step 6 – Make the Stem

Fold the stem piece lengthwise with right sides together.

Sew along the long edge.

Turn right side out.

Press flat.

Topstitch if desired.

The stem should have a slightly rounded appearance.



Step 7 – Attach the Leaf, Stem, and Button

Position the stem at the top center of the pear.

Place the leaf slightly overlapping the stem.

Pin everything securely.

Baste the pieces in place using a long stitch.

Sew a decorative button near the base of the leaf.

The button is decorative but also gives the organizer its charming handcrafted appearance.

Double-check that everything is centered before continuing.



Step 8 – Assemble the Main Body

Place:

- **Front body (with pocket)**
- **Back body**

Right sides together.

Position the stem and leaf inside the layers.

Pin around the entire edge.

Sew all around the organizer.

Leave an opening near the bottom for turning.

Trim excess seam allowance.

Clip curves where necessary.

Turn the organizer right side out.

Carefully shape every curve using a blunt tool.

Press thoroughly.

A well-pressed project always looks more professional.

Step 9 – Apply the Bias Binding

Starting near the bottom edge:

Wrap the bias binding evenly around the organizer.

Pin or clip every few inches.

As you sew:

- **Keep the binding centered.**
- **Stretch gently around curves.**
- **Miter corners if necessary.**
- **Maintain consistent stitching.**

When you reach the starting point, overlap the binding neatly.

Finish with a secure backstitch.

The binding gives the organizer strength while creating a beautiful decorative border.

Step 10 – Final Finishing

Press the entire organizer one last time.

Topstitch around the outer edge if desired.

Inspect:

- **Pocket seams**
- **Binding**
- **Leaf**
- **Stem**
- **Button**
- **Loose threads**

Trim any remaining thread tails.

Your Pear Pocket Organizer is now complete.

Sewing Tips for Best Results

 **Always prewash cotton fabrics before cutting.**

 **Press after every major sewing step.**

 **Use quilting cotton for easier sewing.**

 **Match thread color to the main fabric for nearly invisible seams.**

 **Sew slowly around curved edges.**

 **Clip seam allowances on curves for a smoother finish.**

 **Use sewing clips instead of pins when attaching bias binding.**

 **Test your stitch length on scrap fabric before sewing the project.**

Care Instructions

To keep your organizer looking beautiful:

- **Hand wash with cold or lukewarm water.**
- **Use mild detergent.**
- **Do not bleach.**
- **Lay flat or hang to dry.**
- **Iron on a warm cotton setting if needed.**
- **Avoid high heat directly on the button.**
