

HOUSE WALL POCKET ORGANIZER

♥ SEWING TUTORIAL ♥

Step-by-step guide to make your own fabric house organizer



FINISHED SIZE

Height (without hook): 36 cm
Width: 24 cm

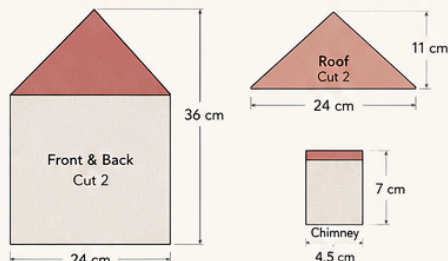
MATERIALS

- Cotton fabric (quilt weight)
- Fusible fleece (thin)
- Cotton batting
- Fabric for binding
- Hook or ring for hanging
- Snap button (optional)
- Sewing thread
- Basic sewing tools

FABRICS (FROM THE USA)

- Main fabric: Cotton
- Lining: Cotton
- Interfacing: Fusible fleece (Pellon®)
- Batting: Cotton batting (Warm & Natural®)

MAIN PATTERN PIECES (ALL MEASUREMENTS INCLUDE 1 CM SEAM ALLOWANCE)



POCKETS (CUT AS INDICATED)



♥ STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS ♥

1 PREPARE THE MAIN PIECES

Cut all the pieces as indicated. Fuse the interfacing to the wrong side of the front and back pieces (roof and body).



2 QUILT (OPTIONAL)

Quilt the front house piece with diagonal or grid stitching for a charming textured look.



3 MAKE THE POCKETS

Sew the pocket pieces. Fold the top edge 1 cm to the wrong side and topstitch. Add decorative details (appliqué, buttons, etc.)



4 POSITION THE POCKETS

Arrange and pin the pockets on the front piece. Topstitch the sides and bottom to secure.



5 SEW THE CHIMNEY

Sew the chimney pieces right sides together. Turn right side out and topstitch. Attach to the back of the roof as shown.



6 ASSEMBLE THE FRONT (ROOF + BODY)

Place the roof piece on top of the body piece, right sides together. Sew across. Press the seam open.



7 ASSEMBLE FRONT & BACK

Place front and back pieces right sides together. Sew around the sides and bottom. Leave the top open.



8 BIND THE EDGES

Cut binding strips 4 cm wide. Fold in half lengthwise, then sew around all edges to finish neatly.



9 ADD HANGING HOOK

Insert a hook or ring at the top center. Stitch securely.



10 ADD SNAP (OPTIONAL)

Add a snap button to the little door on the bottom right pocket.



11 FINISHED!

Your house wall pocket organizer is ready to hang and use. Perfect for storing pens, notes, scissors, or small treasures!



MAIN SEWING METHODS USED

- Seam Allowance: 1 cm
- Topstitching
- Binding
- Appliqué
- Quilting
- Turning
- Pressing
- Hand or Machine Sewing

TIPS

- Use coordinating fabrics for a charming patchwork look.
- Fusible fleece adds structure without bulk.
- Press each seam for a professional finish.
- You can personalize the pockets with appliqué or embroidery.

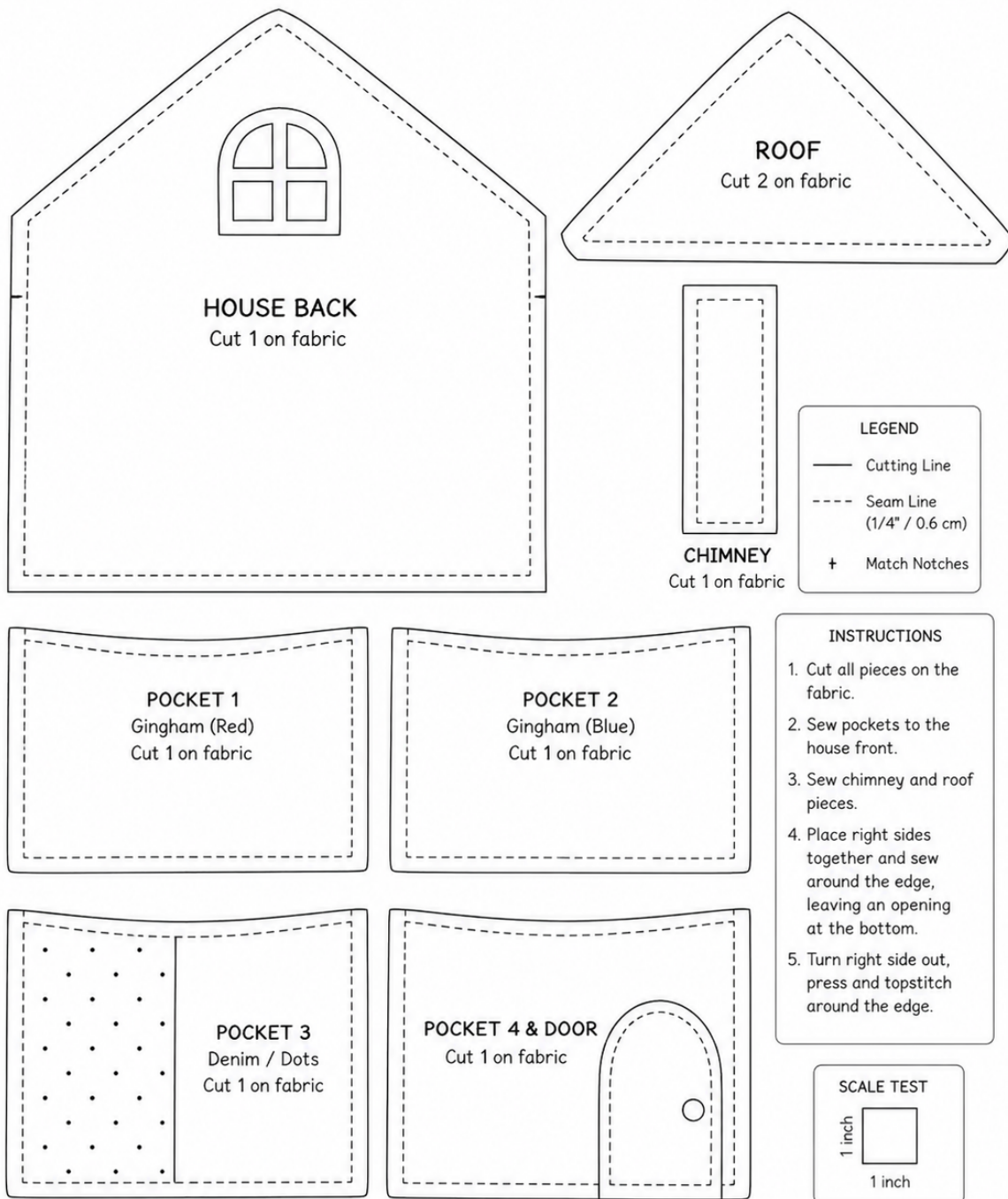

House Wall Pocket Organizer Sewing Tutorial – Complete Step-by-Step Guide

Welcome to this detailed sewing tutorial! In this guide, you will learn how to create a beautiful House Wall Pocket Organizer, perfect for organizing pens, scissors, craft tools, sewing accessories, mail, notes, or small household items.

This tutorial follows the pattern and measurements shown in the original diagram while providing much more detailed explanations, making it easy for beginners and enjoyable for experienced sewists alike.

The organizer measures approximately:

- Height (without hanging hook): 36 cm (14 $\frac{1}{4}$ ")
- Width: 24 cm (9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ")
- Seam allowance: 1 cm ($\frac{3}{8}$ ") throughout the project.

Materials

Before starting, gather everything you need.

Fabrics

- Main cotton fabric (quilting cotton recommended)
- Cotton lining fabric
- Coordinating fabrics for the pockets
- Small contrasting fabric for the chimney
- Fabric for binding

Interfacing

- Lightweight fusible fleece
- Cotton batting

Hardware

- **Metal ring or hanging hook**
- **Optional snap button**

Sewing Supplies

- **Sewing machine**
- **Iron**
- **Ironing board**
- **Fabric scissors**
- **Rotary cutter (optional)**
- **Cutting mat**
- **Quilting ruler**
- **Fabric clips or pins**
- **Hand sewing needle**
- **Matching thread**
- **Fabric marker**
- **Measuring tape**

Fabric Recommendations

For the best results, choose high-quality quilting cotton.

Ideal combinations include:

- **Solid linen with gingham pockets**
- **Floral cotton with neutral backgrounds**
- **Country-style patchwork fabrics**
- **Homespun cotton**
- **Japanese cotton prints**
- **Small plaid fabrics**

Avoid fabrics that stretch excessively.

Cutting the Pattern Pieces

Cut all pieces before beginning construction.

Main House

Cut 2

- **Width: 24 cm**
- **Total height: 36 cm**

One piece will become the front.

One piece will become the back.

Roof

Cut 2

Measurements:

- **Width: 24 cm**
- **Height: 11 cm**

Chimney

Cut 2

Measurements:

- **Width: 4.5 cm**
- **Height: 7 cm**

Upper Left Pocket

Cut 1

- Width: 12 cm
- Height: 10 cm

Upper Right Pocket

Cut 1

- Width: 12 cm
- Height: 10 cm

Lower Left Pocket

Cut 1

- Width: 12 cm
- Height: 11 cm

Lower Right Pocket

Cut 1

- Width: 12 cm
- Height: 11 cm

Batting

Cut batting pieces matching:

- Front
- Back
- Roof

Fusible Fleece

Cut matching pieces for:

- **Front**
- **Back**

H2: Step 1 – Prepare the Main Pieces 🏠

Fuse the fusible fleece to the wrong side of the front and back house pieces.

Next, layer:

- **Fabric**
- **Batting**
- **Backing fabric**

Press carefully using steam.

Allow the pieces to cool completely before moving them.

Keeping everything flat now will make assembly much easier later.

H2: Step 2 – Quilt the Front Panel ✨

Although optional, quilting gives the organizer a professional appearance.

Using your sewing machine:

- **Draw diagonal lines.**
- **Space them evenly.**
- **Sew slowly.**
- **Rotate the piece.**

- Quilt in the opposite direction.

This creates a beautiful diamond pattern across the roof and body.

Trim any uneven edges after quilting.

Press from the back.

H2: Step 3 – Make the Pockets

Each pocket is constructed individually.

Fold the upper edge toward the wrong side.

Press.

Fold once more.

Topstitch close to the folded edge.

This creates a clean professional finish.

Repeat for every pocket.

If desired, decorate them before attaching:

- Appliqué
- Lace
- Embroidery
- Decorative buttons
- Labels
- Fabric flowers
- Patchwork pieces

Keep embellishments away from the seam allowance.

H2: Step 4 – Position the Pockets 📌

Lay the quilted front panel flat.

Arrange the four pockets exactly as shown:

Top Row

- Upper Left Pocket
- Upper Right Pocket

Bottom Row

- Lower Left Pocket
- Lower Right Pocket

Make sure all pockets are evenly spaced.

Measure carefully.

Pin or clip each pocket.

Topstitch around:

- Left side
- Bottom
- Right side

Leave the top edge open.

Backstitch at the beginning and end of every seam for durability.

H2: Step 5 – Sew the Chimney 🏠

Place both chimney pieces with right sides together.

Sew around the sides and top.

Leave the bottom open.

Trim the corners.

Turn right side out.

Press neatly.

Topstitch if desired.

Position the chimney on the back of the roof exactly as illustrated.

Sew securely.

H2: Step 6 – Assemble the Roof and Body ❤️

Place the roof piece on top of the body piece.

Align the center carefully.

Pin.

Sew using a 1 cm seam allowance.

Press the seam open.

Topstitch if desired for extra strength.

Repeat with the back panel.

H2: Step 7 – Assemble Front and Back 🧵

Place:

- **Front panel**
- **Back panel**

Right sides together.

Match every corner.

Clip securely.

Sew around:

- **Left side**
- **Roof**
- **Right side**
- **Bottom**

Leave the top opening if your construction method requires turning.

Trim seam allowances.

Clip roof corners.

Turn right side out.

Push corners gently using a turning tool.

Press thoroughly.

H2: Step 8 – Bind the Edges

Cut binding strips approximately 4 cm wide.

Join strips if necessary.

Fold in half lengthwise.

Press.

Attach the binding around the entire organizer.

Fold over the raw edges.

Stitch close to the folded edge.

Take your time around the roof angles.

A neatly sewn binding makes the entire project look polished.

H2: Step 9 – Add the Hanging Hook

Locate the center of the roof.

Insert:

- **Metal ring**
- **Hanging hook**

Sew securely using several rows of stitching.

The hanging hardware should comfortably support the weight of the organizer when filled.

H2: Step 10 – Add the Optional Snap

If making the decorative flap shown in the diagram:

Install a snap fastener.

Position the female half on the pocket.

Attach the male half to the flap.

Check that it opens and closes smoothly.

H2: Step 11 – Final Pressing and Inspection

Inspect every seam.

Trim loose threads.

Press the entire organizer carefully.

Check that:

- **Every pocket is secure.**
- **The binding is smooth.**
- **The chimney is straight.**
- **The hook is firmly attached.**
- **The organizer hangs evenly.**

Your House Wall Pocket Organizer is now finished!

Main Sewing Techniques Used

Throughout this project, you will practice:

- **1 cm seam allowance**
- **Topstitching**
- **Quilting**
- **Fusible interfacing**
- **Binding**
- **Turning**
- **Pressing**
- **Pocket construction**
- **Basic appliqué**
- **Decorative stitching**
- **Accurate measuring**
- **Edge finishing**

Care Instructions

To keep your organizer looking beautiful:

- Machine wash cold
- Use a gentle cycle
- Do not bleach
- Tumble dry on low heat
- Warm iron as needed
- Avoid excessive heat on fusible fleece

Helpful Tips



- Press after every major seam.
- Always backstitch at the beginning and end of seams.
- Use quilting clips instead of pins for thick layers.
- Choose coordinating fabrics for a cohesive look.
- Label your pattern pieces before sewing.
- Test your stitch length on scrap fabric first.
- Use matching thread for an invisible finish or contrasting thread for a decorative effect.
- Quilting gloves can improve control while stitching the diamond pattern.
- Keep seam allowances consistent throughout the project.
- Measure pocket placement twice before sewing.
- A walking foot helps feed multiple fabric layers evenly.
- Personalize the organizer with embroidery, appliqué, labels, or decorative buttons to make it uniquely yours.
