



Quilted Flower Basket Wall Hanging

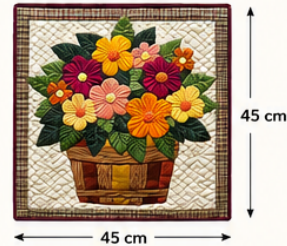
Step-by-Step Tutorial

Finished size: 45 x 45 cm

MATERIALS

- Assorted cotton fabrics for flowers, leaves, basket
- Background fabric (cream) 55 x 55 cm
- Border fabric (plaid) 10 x 45 cm (2 strips) 10 x 65 cm (2 strips)
- Backing fabric 55 x 55 cm
- Batting 55 x 55 cm
- Fusible web (for appliqué)
- Matching threads
- Sewing needle
- Quilting needle
- Rotary cutter, ruler, cutting mat
- Iron and pressing cloth

FINISHED SIZE

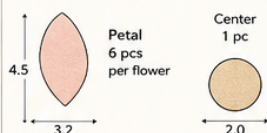


CUTTING GUIDE (seam allowance 0.7 cm)

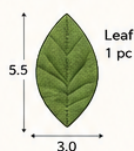
- Background: 1 square 45 x 45 cm
- Border (plaid):
 - 2 strips 10 x 45 cm (sides)
 - 2 strips 10 x 65 cm (top & bottom)
- Backing: 1 square 55 x 55 cm
- Batting: 1 square 55 x 55 cm
- Fabric for basket, flowers, leaves: cut pieces according to template

1. APPLIQUÉ PIECES (All measurements in cm)

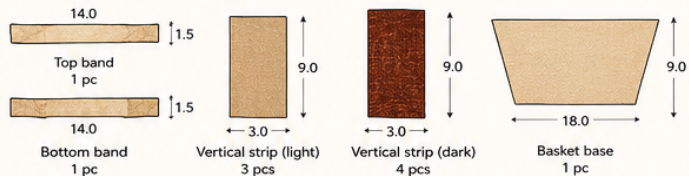
FLOWERS (6-PETAL)



LEAVES



BASKET



2. HOW TO MAKE (STEP-BY-STEP)

1 PREPARE APPLIQUÉ PIECES



Cut all pieces using the templates above. Fuse the wrong side of the fabric pieces with fusible web and cut again on the line.

2 APPLIQUÉ THE BASKET



Arrange and fuse the basket pieces on the background fabric. Secure with a zigzag or blanket stitch.

3 ARRANGE THE FLOWERS AND LEAVES



Arrange flowers and leaves above the basket. Fuse in place and stitch around each piece.

4 QUILTING THE BACKGROUND



Quilt the background with diagonal lines or a diamond pattern. (Use a walking foot if possible.)

5 ADD THE INNER BORDER



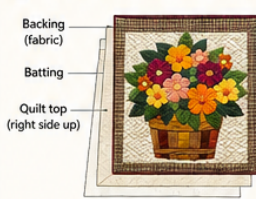
Sew the side borders first (10 x 45 cm), then the top and bottom borders (10 x 65 cm). Press seams open.

6 QUILT THE BORDERS



Quilt around the borders 0.3 cm inside the seam to secure them and add definition.

7 ASSEMBLE THE QUILT SANDWICH



Layer the backing (right side down), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste all layers together.

8 BINDING



Cut binding strips 6 cm wide. Join and fold in half. Sew to the front, turn to the back, and hand stitch.

3. MAIN TECHNIQUES USED



Appliqué
Fusing fabric pieces to the background and stitching around the edges.



Straight Stitch
Used for piecing and attaching borders.



Zigzag Stitch
Used to secure appliqué edges.



Quilting (Diagonal / Diamond)
Adds texture and stability to the quilt.



Binding
Finishes the edges for a clean and durable result.

TIPS

- Press all pieces before stitching.
- Use coordinating thread colors.
- Take your time arranging the flowers before fusing.
- Quilting not only beautifies the quilt but also keeps it firm.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- Hand wash or machine wash on gentle cycle.
- Use mild detergent.
- Do not bleach.
- Lay flat to dry.
- Iron on low if needed.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Cut fabric pieces following the solid line.
2. Stitch around each piece using a 1/4 inch seam.
3. Arrange and applique onto your background.
4. Quilt as desired. Enjoy your project!

FLOWER BASKET APPLIQUÉ PATTERN

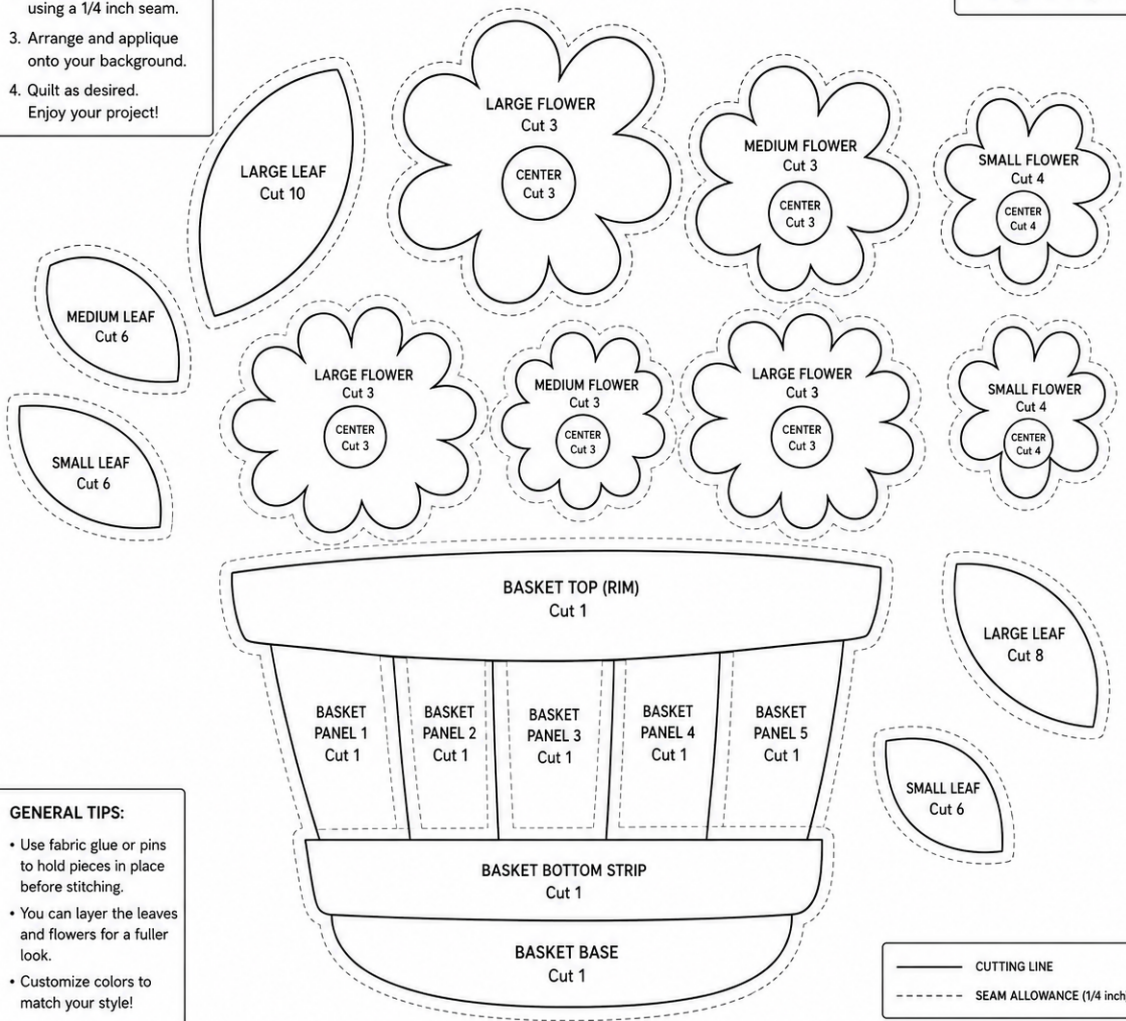
For Quilting / Wall Hanging / Pillow

Seam Allowance: 1/4 inch (6 mm)

All pieces include seam allowance.

NOTE:

This pattern does not include the background, batting or backing.

**GENERAL TIPS:**

- Use fabric glue or pins to hold pieces in place before stitching.
- You can layer the leaves and flowers for a fuller look.
- Customize colors to match your style!

Quilted Flower Basket Wall Hanging – Complete Step-by-Step Tutorial

Create a beautiful Quilted Flower Basket Wall Hanging featuring colorful appliqué flowers, a woven basket, quilted background, and classic plaid borders. This project combines

raw-edge fusible appliqué, machine quilting, and traditional quilt binding, making it suitable for confident beginners and experienced quilters alike.

Finished Size: 17³/₄" × 17³/₄" (45 × 45 cm)



Difficulty: Beginner to Intermediate



Techniques: Fusible Appliqué, Straight Stitch, Zigzag Stitch, Quilting, Binding

Materials and Supplies

Prepare all materials before beginning your project.

Fabrics

- **Assorted cotton fabrics for flower petals**
- **Green cotton fabrics for leaves**
- **Brown and beige cotton fabrics for the basket**
- **Cream cotton fabric for the quilt background**
- **Plaid cotton fabric for the borders**
- **Cotton fabric for backing**

Batting

- **Cotton or cotton/poly batting**
- **Size: 22" × 22" (55 × 55 cm)**

Fusible Products

- **Lightweight fusible web for appliqué**

Thread

Use high-quality cotton or polyester thread in coordinating colors:

- **Cream**

- Green
- Brown
- Yellow
- Orange
- Burgundy

Sewing Tools

- Sewing machine
- Rotary cutter
- Acrylic ruler
- Cutting mat
- Sharp fabric scissors
- Small embroidery scissors
- Fabric marking pencil
- Iron
- Ironing board
- Pins or fabric clips
- Quilting safety pins
- Walking foot (recommended)
- Zigzag or blanket stitch foot (optional)

Finished Quilt Measurements

The completed wall hanging measures:

- Width: 17³/₄" (45 cm)
- Height: 17³/₄" (45 cm)

The center design is surrounded by decorative plaid borders that frame the basket beautifully.

Fabric Cutting Guide

Cut all pieces before sewing.

Background

Cut:

- **1 square measuring $17\frac{3}{4}" \times 17\frac{3}{4}"$ (45 × 45 cm)**

Border Fabric

Cut:

- **2 strips measuring $4" \times 17\frac{3}{4}"$ (10 × 45 cm) for the sides**
- **2 strips measuring $4" \times 25\frac{1}{2}"$ (10 × 65 cm) for the top and bottom**

Backing Fabric

Cut:

- **1 square measuring $22" \times 22"$ (55 × 55 cm)**

Batting

Cut:

- **1 square measuring $22" \times 22"$ (55 × 55 cm)**

Appliqué Templates

Prepare all template pieces before fusing them to fabric.

Flower Petals

Each flower contains:

- **6 petals**

Each petal measures approximately:

- $1\frac{1}{4}" \times 1\frac{3}{4}"$
(3.2 × 4.5 cm)

Flower Centers

Cut:

- 1 circle for each flower

Diameter:

- $\frac{3}{4}"$
(2 cm)

Leaves

Each leaf measures approximately:

- $1\frac{1}{4}" \times 2\frac{1}{4}"$
(3 × 5.5 cm)

Cut enough leaves to create a full arrangement around the flowers.

Basket Pieces

Cut the following pieces:

Basket Base

- 1 trapezoid
- Top width: approximately 7"
- Height: $3\frac{1}{2}"$

Top Basket Band

- 1 strip
- $5\frac{1}{2}" \times \frac{5}{8}"$

Bottom Basket Band

- **1 strip**
- **5½" × ⅝"**

Vertical Light Strips

Cut:

- **3 strips**

Vertical Dark Strips

Cut:

- **4 strips**

Alternate light and dark fabrics to create the woven basket effect.

Step 1 – Prepare the Appliqué Pieces

 **Begin by preparing every appliqué shape.**

- 1. Trace every template onto the paper side of the fusible web.**
- 2. Rough-cut around each traced shape.**
- 3. Fuse the web onto the wrong side of each fabric following the manufacturer's instructions.**
- 4. Allow everything to cool completely.**
- 5. Cut every shape precisely along the template lines.**
- 6. Remove the paper backing.**

You should now have:

- **Flower petals**
- **Flower centers**
- **Leaves**

- **Basket pieces**

Keep similar pieces grouped together to make assembly easier.

Step 2 – Assemble the Basket

 **Create the basket before attaching the flowers.**

Lay out the vertical strips in alternating colors.

Example:

Light – Dark – Light – Dark – Light – Dark – Dark

Arrange the strips until the basket has a balanced woven appearance.

Attach the top and bottom basket bands.

Press every seam carefully.

Position the completed basket near the bottom center of the cream background.

Fuse it in place.

Secure the edges using either:

- **Narrow zigzag stitch**
- **Blanket stitch**

Take your time around every corner for smooth, clean stitching.

Step 3 – Arrange the Flowers and Leaves

 This is the creative stage.

Begin placing the largest flowers first.

Spread them evenly throughout the arrangement.

Next:

- **Add medium flowers**
- **Fill empty spaces with smaller flowers**

Insert leaves beneath the flowers.

Angle the leaves naturally so they appear to grow from inside the basket.

Overlap petals slightly to create depth.

Before fusing:

- **Step back several feet.**
- **Check color balance.**
- **Adjust spacing.**
- **Ensure the arrangement looks symmetrical but natural.**

Once satisfied:

Fuse every piece permanently.

Step 4 – Stitch Every Appliqué Piece

Now secure the entire design.

Sew around:

- **Every petal**
- **Every leaf**
- **Every flower center**
- **Every basket piece**

Recommended stitches:

- **Narrow zigzag**
- **Blanket stitch**
- **Decorative appliqué stitch**

Sew slowly around curves.

Pivot frequently.

Trim thread tails neatly.

The appliqué should now be completely secured.

Step 5 – Quilt the Background



The original design features diagonal quilting.

Mark diagonal quilting lines across the cream background.

Create a diamond pattern by quilting one direction first.

Rotate the quilt.

Quilt the opposite diagonal direction.

A walking foot helps maintain even feeding.

Keep quilting lines evenly spaced.

Avoid quilting directly over thick flower layers whenever possible.

This quilting adds:

- **Texture**
- **Stability**
- **Professional appearance**

Step 6 – Add the Plaid Borders

Attach the borders in this order.

Side Borders

Sew the two shorter strips onto the left and right sides.

Press seams toward the borders.

Top and Bottom Borders

Attach the longer strips.

Match corners carefully.

Press all seams flat.

Step 7 – Quilt the Borders

Continue quilting into the border fabric.

Use diagonal quilting to match the center.

Quilt approximately $\frac{1}{8}$ " inside the seam where the border meets the center.

This secures the borders while adding definition.

Maintain even stitch length throughout.

Step 8 – Assemble the Quilt Sandwich

Layer the quilt as follows.

Bottom:

Backing fabric (right side facing down)

Middle:

Batting

Top:

Quilt top (right side facing up)

Center all three layers.

Smooth wrinkles carefully.

Pin with quilting safety pins every 4–5 inches.

Baste the layers together before final quilting if desired.

Step 9 – Trim the Quilt

Once quilting is complete:

Trim away the excess batting and backing.

Square every corner carefully.

Use a large quilting ruler to ensure the wall hanging remains perfectly square.

Step 10 – Attach the Binding

Cut binding strips approximately:

- **2½" (6 cm) wide**

Join strips with diagonal seams.

Press the binding in half lengthwise.

Attach the binding to the front using a ¼" seam allowance.

Fold the binding over the edge.

Turn it to the back.

Hand stitch the folded edge using an invisible ladder stitch.

Miter every corner neatly for a professional finish.

Final Pressing

Give the quilt one final pressing.

Use a pressing cloth over the appliqué to protect delicate fabrics.

Avoid excessive steam if using fusible appliqué.

The quilt should now lie flat with crisp borders and beautifully textured quilting.

Care Instructions

 **To keep your quilt looking beautiful for years:**

- **Hand wash whenever possible.**
- **Machine wash only on a gentle cycle.**
- **Use cold water.**
- **Use mild detergent.**
- **Never use bleach.**
- **Lay flat to dry.**
- **Iron on low heat if needed.**

- **Store flat or rolled rather than folded to reduce permanent creases.**

Techniques Used

Throughout this project you will practice several classic quilting techniques:

- **Fusible Appliqué – Fusing fabric shapes before stitching them permanently.**
- **Straight Stitch – Used for construction and border assembly.**
- **Blanket Stitch or Zigzag Stitch – Secures the appliqué edges while adding decorative detail.**
- **Diagonal Machine Quilting – Creates the elegant diamond texture seen in the background.**
- **Traditional Quilt Binding – Finishes the raw edges for durability and a clean professional appearance.**

Helpful Tips for Success



- **Read through the entire tutorial before beginning.**
- **Prewash fabrics if shrinkage is a concern.**
- **Press every seam immediately after sewing.**
- **Use a new rotary blade for accurate cutting.**
- **Test your appliqué stitch on scrap fabric first.**
- **Arrange the flowers several times before fusing them.**
- **Keep your stitch length consistent.**
- **Use matching thread for nearly invisible appliqué.**
- **Quilt from the center outward to prevent puckering.**
- **Measure twice before cutting border strips.**

- Trim thread tails frequently for a polished finish.
- Enjoy the creative process—small variations make every quilt unique.
