

CROCHET GLASSES CASE

♥ STEP-BY-STEP TUTORIAL ♥

Make a cute crochet glasses case – perfect for gifts!



MATERIALS

- Worsted weight yarn:
 - Skin color (beige)
 - Pink (cheeks & nose)
 - White (hair)
 - Black (mouth)
- 3.5 mm (E) crochet hook
- 2 black safety eyes (10 mm)
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch markers
- Optional: glasses for size reference



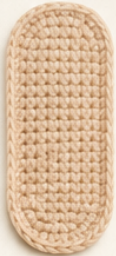
FINISHED SIZE

Approx. 7.5" (19 cm) wide
x 3.5" (9 cm) high

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS

1 BASE (Make 2)

With skin color yarn.
Ch 20.
Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (19 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in first st, sc in each st across, 2 sc in last st. (21 sc)
Rows 3–6: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. (21 sc)
Fasten off.



2 EDGING (Make 2)

Join yarn in any corner.
Round 1: Ch 1, sc evenly around the edge:
• 3 sc in each corner
• Sc in each side st
Join with sl st to first sc.
Fasten off and weave in ends.



3 EARS (Make 2)

With skin color yarn.
Magic ring.
Round 1: 6 sc in ring. (6)
Round 2: 2 sc in each st. (12)
Round 3: Sc in each st. (12)
Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



4 NOSE

With pink yarn.
Magic ring.
Round 1: 6 sc in ring. (6)
Round 2: 2 sc in each st. (12)
Round 3: Sc in each st. (12)
Round 4: 2 sc, sc, 2 sc, sc, 2 sc, sc, 2 sc. (16)
Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



5 CHEEKS (Make 2)

With pink yarn.
Magic ring.
Round 1: 6 sc in ring. (6)
Round 2: 2 sc in each st. (12)
Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



6 HAIR

With white yarn.
Ch 11.
Row 1: In 2nd ch from hook, make 3 dc in same st, *sk 1 ch, sl st in next ch, 3 dc in next ch* repeat across. Fasten off.



7 FACE DETAILS

- Insert safety eyes between Rows 3 and 4, spaced about 7 stitches apart.
- Sew nose in the center below the eyes.
- Sew cheeks on each side below the eyes.
- Embroider mouth with black yarn.



8 ASSEMBLE

Place the two base pieces together (right sides out). Sc around the entire edge to join:
• Sc in each st
• 3 sc in each corner
Fasten off and weave in ends.



9 ATTACH EARS & HAIR

- Sew ears to each side of the case.
- Sew hair piece on the top center.



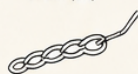
10 DONE!

Your cute crochet glasses case is ready!
Perfect for protecting your glasses in style.



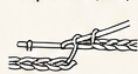
BASIC CROCHET STITCHES (US TERMS)

Chain (ch)



Yarn over, pull through loop on hook.

Slip Stitch (sl st)



Insert hook, yarn over, pull through both loops on hook.

Single Crochet (sc)



Insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.

Double Crochet (dc)



Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 2 loops.

Magic Ring



Wrap yarn, insert hook, pull up a loop, chain 1, work stitches into ring.

TIPS

- Use stitch markers on corners to keep edges even.
- Weave in all ends securely.
- Adjust the size by using more or fewer foundation chains.
- Great handmade gift idea!



Crochet Glasses Holder

Pattern & Stitches Guide



MATERIALS

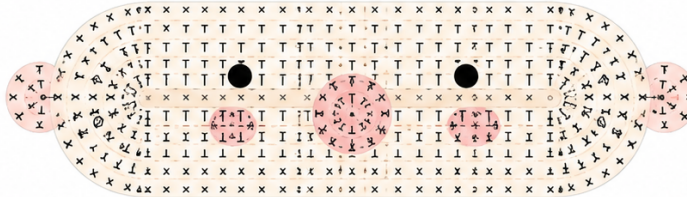
- Worsted weight cotton yarn
 - Skin color (beige)
 - Pink (blush & nose)
 - White (hair)
 - Black (mouth & eyes)
- 3.0 mm (D) crochet hook
- Black safety eyes 10 mm
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch marker
- Fiberfill (for nose and ears)

CROCHET STITCHES (US TERMS)

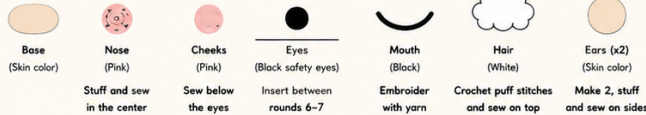
- Chain (ch)
- Slip stitch (sl st)
- + Single crochet (sc)
- ⏏ Half double crochet (hdc)
- ⏏ Double crochet (dc)
- ⦶ Puff stitch (pf)

* Work in continuous rounds (spiral) unless otherwise stated.

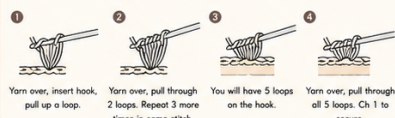

- Sew all parts securely.
- Weave in all ends.
- Your glasses holder is ready!

ABBREVIATIONS (US TERMS)

ch = chain
sl st = slip stitch
sc = single crochet
hdc = half double crochet
dc = double crochet
pf = puff stitch
st(s) = stitch(es)
() = total stitches in round

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Crochet Glasses Case – Complete Step-by-Step Tutorial

This adorable **crochet glasses case** is designed to look like a cheerful face wearing glasses. The soft crocheted construction helps protect your eyeglasses from light scratches while keeping them easy to find inside a purse, backpack, or drawer.

The case is made from two identical rounded rectangular panels. Small crocheted ears, cheeks, a dimensional nose, safety eyes, embroidered details, and curly white hair complete the character. You may place your own glasses over the finished face or use an inexpensive decorative pair.

This tutorial uses **US crochet terminology** and follows the measurements, materials, and construction shown in the original pattern.

Finished Size

The completed case measures approximately:

7.5 inches wide × 3.5 inches high

19 cm wide × 9 cm high

The finished measurements may vary slightly depending on your yarn, hook size, and tension.

Gauge is not essential for this project. However, both base panels must be the same size so they can be joined evenly.

Materials

You will need:

- Worsted-weight yarn in a skin-tone beige
- Worsted-weight pink yarn for the cheeks and nose
- Worsted-weight white yarn for the hair
- Worsted-weight black yarn for the embroidered mouth
- 3.5 mm crochet hook, US size E
- Two 10 mm black safety eyes
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch markers
- Optional eyeglasses for size reference and decoration
- Fiberfill for lightly stuffing the nose, if desired

Choose a smooth yarn with clearly visible stitches. Cotton or a cotton-blend yarn will create a firm case, while acrylic yarn will make the case softer and more flexible.

Crochet Abbreviations

This pattern uses the following US crochet abbreviations:

- **ch** – chain
- **sc** – single crochet
- **dc** – double crochet
- **sl st** – slip stitch
- **st** – stitch
- **sts** – stitches
- **rep** – repeat
- **rnd** – round

Numbers inside parentheses show the total number of stitches at the end of a row or round.

Important Pattern Notes

The case is made from two base panels. One panel becomes the decorated front, while the second becomes the back.

Chain stitches at the beginning of a row do not count as stitches unless stated otherwise.

Use a stitch marker to identify the first stitch of each round.

Keep your tension firm enough to create a protective fabric, but do not crochet so tightly that the panels become stiff or distorted.

Before sewing or joining the pieces, weave in any yarn tails that will not be used for assembly.

Step 1: Crochet the Base Panels

Make **two identical panels** using the skin-tone yarn.

These panels form the front and back of the glasses case.

Foundation Chain

Ch 20.

Row 1: Sc in the second ch from the hook and in each remaining ch across. You should have 19 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1 and turn. Work 2 sc in the first st, sc in each of the next 17 sts, and work 2 sc in the final st. You should have 21 sc.

Rows 3–6: Ch 1 and turn. Sc in each st across. You should have 21 sc in every row.

Fasten off.

Repeat the complete instructions to make the second panel.

At this stage, the panels will look like small rectangles. The edging added in the next step creates the softly rounded shape.

Step 2: Add the Rounded Edging

Make the edging on both base panels using the same skin-tone yarn.

Join the yarn with a slip stitch in any corner of the panel.

Round 1: Ch 1. Sc evenly around the entire outside edge.

To create the rounded corners:

- Work 3 sc in each corner.
- Work evenly spaced sc along both long sides.
- Work evenly spaced sc across both short ends.

Join with a sl st to the first sc.

Fasten off and weave in the ends.

Repeat on the second panel.

Take time to distribute the stitches evenly. If too many stitches are added, the panel may ripple. If too few stitches are added, the edges may pull inward.

Place the two panels together after completing the edging. Check that they are the same size and shape.

Step 3: Crochet the Ears

Make **two ears** with the skin-tone yarn.

Begin with a magic ring.

Round 1: Work 6 sc into the magic ring. Pull the ring closed. You should have 6 sts.

Round 2: Work 2 sc in each st around. You should have 12 sts.

Round 3: Sc in each st around. You should have 12 sts.

Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

The ears should be small, flat circles. Do not stuff them.

Gently shape each ear with your fingers. Leave the yarn tails attached because they will be used to sew the ears to the sides of the finished case.

Step 4: Crochet the Nose

Use the pink yarn for the nose.

Begin with a magic ring.

Round 1: Work 6 sc into the magic ring. Pull the ring closed. You should have 6 sts.

Round 2: Work 2 sc in each st around. You should have 12 sts.

Round 3: Sc in each st around. You should have 12 sts.

Round 4: Repeat the following sequence around:

- 2 sc in the next st

- Sc in each of the next 2 sts

You should have 16 sts at the end of the round.

Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

The nose should form a shallow rounded cup. You may place a very small amount of fiberfill inside before sewing it to the face. Do not overstuff it, or the nose may become too large and firm.

Step 5: Crochet the Cheeks

Make **two cheeks** with the pink yarn.

Begin with a magic ring.

Round 1: Work 6 sc into the magic ring. Pull the ring closed. You should have 6 sts.

Round 2: Work 2 sc in each st around. You should have 12 sts.

Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

The cheeks should remain flat. Gently flatten and shape them before attaching them to the face.

Step 6: Crochet the Curly Hair

Use the white yarn.

Ch 11.

Row 1: Beginning in the second ch from the hook, work 3 dc in the same ch.

Continue across the foundation chain using the following sequence:

- Sl st in the next ch
- Work 3 dc in the next ch
- Sl st in the next ch

Repeat this sequence across the chain.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

The groups of double crochet stitches will naturally curl and form a row of soft white loops.

If the hair appears twisted, gently arrange the curls with your fingers before sewing it to the case.

Step 7: Add the Face Details

Choose one base panel to become the front of the case.

Lay the panel flat with the right side facing you. Before permanently attaching anything, arrange the eyes, nose, and cheeks on the panel to check their placement.

Attach the Safety Eyes

Insert the two safety eyes between Rows 3 and 4 of the base.

Position them approximately seven stitches apart.

Check that the eyes are level before attaching the washers on the back.

Once safety-eye washers are attached, they can be difficult or impossible to remove. Confirm the placement carefully before securing them.

Safety eyes are not recommended for projects intended for babies or very young children. Embroidered eyes may be used as an alternative.

Sew on the Nose

Position the nose in the center of the face, slightly below the eyes.

Thread the long pink yarn tail through a yarn needle.

Sew around the outside edge of the nose, attaching it securely to the base panel. Add a small amount of fiberfill before closing the final section, if desired.

Knot the yarn securely on the wrong side.

Sew on the Cheeks

Place one cheek on each side of the nose, just below the eyes.

Use the long yarn tails to sew around the outer edge of each cheek.

Keep the cheeks evenly spaced and level.

Knot the yarn securely on the wrong side and weave in the ends.

Embroider the Mouth

Thread the yarn needle with black yarn.

Embroider a curved smile below the nose.

Use small, neat stitches to create a smooth curve. Avoid pulling the yarn too tightly because this can distort the front panel.

Secure the yarn on the wrong side and weave in the ends.

Step 8: Assemble the Case

Place the two base panels together with the **right sides facing outward**.

The decorated face should remain visible on the outside.

Align all corners and edges. Use stitch markers to hold the two panels together while joining.

Join the skin-tone yarn in a corner.

Sc through both layers around the case to connect them.

Work:

- 1 sc in each st along the edges
- 3 sc in each corner

Leave the necessary opening for inserting and removing the glasses. The opening should be wide enough for the frame you plan to use.

The graphic shows the panels joined around the outside edge. When making a functional case, do not permanently close every side. Leave the upper edge open, or leave a sufficiently large opening along one long side.

Fasten off and weave in the ends.

Check that the seam is secure and that the glasses slide comfortably into the case.

Step 9: Attach the Ears

Place one crocheted ear on each side of the case.

Position the ears at approximately the same height as the eyes.

Using the long yarn tail, sew the flat inner edge of each ear securely to the side seam of the case.

Pass the needle through the ear and the case several times for a strong attachment.

Do not sew through the entire case opening or accidentally close the inside space.

Knot securely and hide the yarn ends inside the case.

Step 10: Attach the Hair

Position the white curly hair across the top center of the face.

Arrange the curls so they sit above the eyes without covering them.

Using the long white yarn tail, sew the foundation chain of the hair to the front panel.

Stitch through the base of each curl rather than through the outer loops. This keeps the curls raised and dimensional.

Secure the yarn and weave in the end.

Gently fluff and arrange the curls after sewing.

Step 11: Add the Glasses

Place a pair of glasses over the finished face.

The glasses may be functional, decorative, or used only for displaying the case.

Position the bridge of the glasses over the crocheted nose and place the arms near the ears.

If the glasses are only decorative, they may be attached with a few removable threads. Do not permanently sew functional prescription glasses to the case.

The case may also be used without glasses on the outside. The crocheted face will still look complete with its safety eyes, nose, cheeks, mouth, ears, and hair.

Basic Crochet Stitches

Chain Stitch

Make a slip knot and place it on the hook.

Yarn over and pull the yarn through the loop already on the hook.

Repeat this movement for the required number of chains.

Keep the chains loose and even so the first row is easy to work.

Slip Stitch

Insert the hook into the indicated stitch.

Yarn over and pull the yarn through the stitch and directly through the loop already on the hook.

A slip stitch is commonly used to join rounds or move across stitches without adding height.

Single Crochet

Insert the hook into the indicated stitch.

Yarn over and pull up a loop. You should have two loops on the hook.

Yarn over again and pull through both loops.

Single crochet creates a firm, dense fabric that is ideal for the body of the glasses case.

Double Crochet

Yarn over before inserting the hook into the indicated stitch.

Insert the hook, yarn over, and pull up a loop. You should have three loops on the hook.

Yarn over and pull through the first two loops.

Yarn over again and pull through the remaining two loops.

The double crochet stitches used in the hair create soft, rounded curls.

Magic Ring

Wrap the yarn around your fingers to create an adjustable loop.

Insert the hook into the loop, yarn over, and pull up a loop.

Chain 1 to secure the loop.

Work the required stitches into the center of the ring.

Pull the yarn tail firmly to close the center opening.

The magic ring is used for the ears, nose, and cheeks.

Finishing and Shaping

Weave in all remaining yarn ends securely.

Inspect the outside and inside of the case for loose threads.

Gently shape the panels and corners with your hands.

Arrange the ears so they sit evenly on both sides.

Center the nose and cheeks if they shifted during assembly.

Fluff the white hair curls.

Test the case with a pair of glasses. Make sure the opening is wide enough and that no safety-eye washers or knots catch on the glasses.

For additional protection, you may hand-sew a soft fabric lining inside the case. A lining is optional and is not included in the original crochet instructions.

Helpful Tips

Use stitch markers at the corners while working the edging and assembly rounds. This helps keep the rounded shape even.

Count the stitches frequently, especially when making the two base panels. The panels must match for a neat finish.

Weave in all yarn ends securely so they do not come loose during use.

Adjust the size by adding or removing foundation chains. Remember that any changes must be made to both base panels.

Use a larger hook for a slightly larger and softer case, or a smaller hook for a firmer and more compact case.

When changing the size of the base, adjust the placement of the eyes, cheeks, nose, ears, and hair proportionally.

Place the decorative pieces on the front panel before sewing them down. This allows you to correct the spacing and create a balanced expression.

Avoid overstuffing the nose. A lightly padded nose looks round and dimensional without interfering with the glasses.

Keep the inside of the case smooth. Hide all knots and yarn tails carefully to reduce the risk of scratching the lenses.

Customization Ideas

Create different characters by changing the skin-tone yarn, hair color, or facial expression.

Use gray, brown, black, or golden yarn for the hair.

Embroider eyebrows above the eyes.

Add a small mustache using black, gray, or white yarn.

Make the cheeks in a deeper pink, coral, or peach shade.

Replace the safety eyes with embroidered eyes.

Add a small crocheted strap or loop to one side of the case.

Create a matching set using different faces for family members.

For a gift, place a cleaning cloth inside the completed case.

Final Result

Your **crochet glasses case** is now complete. The finished case should have a softly rounded rectangular body, two side ears, pink cheeks, a dimensional pink nose, a black embroidered smile, safety eyes, and a row of curly white hair.

Place the glasses over the face for the full character effect, or store them safely inside the case. This charming handmade project is practical, customizable, and perfect for birthdays, holidays, craft fairs, or thoughtful handmade gifts.
