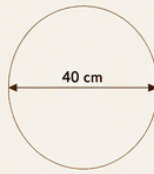




PATCHWORK CHICKENS ROUND QUILTED WALL HANGING

A complete step-by-step tutorial with measurements in CM

FINISHED SIZE
Diameter: 40 cm



FABRIC REQUIREMENTS (Fabric from the USA)

Background (cream)	40 x 40 cm
Border wedges (8 fabrics)	12.5 x 20 cm each
Chicken bodies (5-6 fabrics)	15 x 25 cm each
Combs & wattles (red)	20 x 20 cm
Beaks (yellow)	10 x 10 cm
Eyes (white)	10 x 10 cm
Eyes (black)	5 x 5 cm
Backing fabric	45 x 45 cm
Batting (quilt wadding)	45 x 45 cm
Binding fabric	5 x 110 cm

MAIN METHODS USED

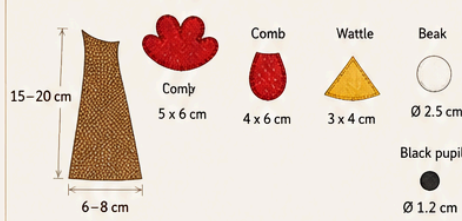
- Appliqué (raw edge)
- Patchwork
- Quilting (stippling)
- Binding
- Hand embroidery (optional)

1. CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

A. CENTER CIRCLE (Background)



B. CHICKEN APPLIQUÉ PIECES (Cut for each chicken)



C. BORDER WEDGES



D. OTHER PIECES

- Backing fabric: 45 x 45 cm
- Batting: 45 x 45 cm
- Binding: 5 x 110 cm

2. APPLIQUÉ THE CHICKENS

1. Place the chicken body on the background circle. Arrange all chickens as desired.



2. Appliqué the body pieces using a small zigzag stitch or blanket stitch.



3. Add combs on top of the heads.



4. Add wattles under the beaks.



5. Add beaks.



6. Add eyes (white circles first, then black pupils on top).



Tip: You can use fusible web under the appliqué pieces to keep them in place before sewing.

3. MAKE THE PATCHWORK BORDER

1. Pair the wedges (two of each fabric).



2. Sew each pair together along the long sides.



3. Press seams open.



4. Sew all 8 pairs together in a ring.



5. Your border ring should measure about 44 cm in diameter (before attaching).



4. ASSEMBLE THE QUILT

1. Place the patchwork ring right sides up.



2. Place the center circle (with chickens) on top, right sides together.



3. Pin all around.



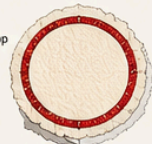
4. Sew together using 1 cm seam allowance.



5. Press the seam open.



6. Layer: backing (right side down), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Pin.



5. QUILTING

Stipple (meandering) quilt the background area. Avoid quilting over the appliqué pieces if preferred.



6. BINDING

1. Fold binding in half lengthwise and press.



2. Sew binding to the front edge with 1 cm seam allowance.



3. Fold binding over to the back and hand stitch.



7. FINISHED!

Your beautiful patchwork chickens wall hanging is ready!



BASIC SEWING METHODS USED

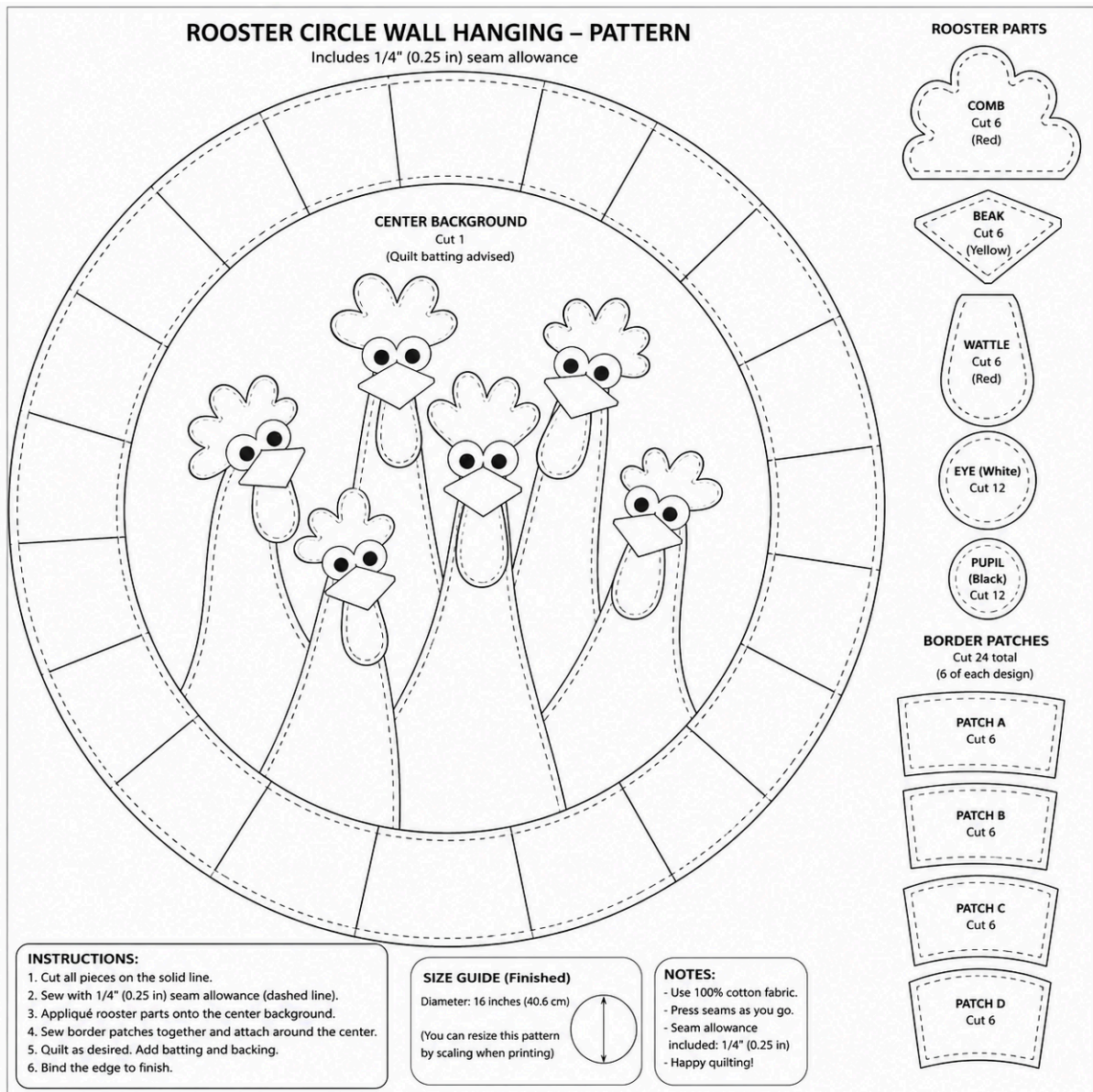
- Appliqué**
Sew shapes onto background using zigzag or blanket stitch.
- Patchwork**
Sew fabric pieces together with straight seams.
- Quilting (Stippling)**
Sew free-motion meandering lines to secure layers.
- Binding**
Bind the raw edge for a clean and durable finish.
- Hand Embroidery (Optional)**
Add decorative stitches like French knots or lazy daisy.

FABRIC TIPS (USA)

- 100% Cotton Quilting fabric works best.
- Pre-wash your fabrics to prevent shrinkage.
- Use quality thread (100% cotton).

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- Hand wash
- or gentle machine wash.
- Air dry flat.
- Do not bleach.

The finished wall hanging measures approximately 40 cm (15³/₄ inches) in diameter and combines patchwork, raw-edge appliqué, quilting, and binding into one beautiful project. Every stage is explained carefully so that anyone in the United States can complete the project successfully from start to finish.

Take your time, prepare all materials before sewing, and enjoy every stitch. Accuracy during cutting and pressing will make the final assembly much easier.

Step 1 – Gather Materials and Supplies

Before beginning, organize all fabrics and sewing tools.

Finished Size

- Diameter: 40 cm (15³/₄")

Fabric Requirements

Background Fabric (Cream)

- 40 × 40 cm

Border Wedges (8 Different Fabrics)

- 12.5 × 20 cm each

Chicken Body Fabrics (5–6 Fabrics)

- 15 × 25 cm each

Comb and Wattle (Red Fabric)

- 20 × 20 cm

Beaks (Yellow Fabric)

- 10 × 10 cm

Eyes (White Fabric)

- 10 × 10 cm

Pupils (Black Fabric)

- 5 × 5 cm

Backing Fabric

- 45 × 45 cm

Batting

- 45 × 45 cm

Binding Fabric

- 5 × 110 cm

Sewing Supplies

 **Sewing machine**

 **Neutral quilting thread**

 **Fabric scissors**


 **Small embroidery scissors**

 **Quilting ruler**

 **Fabric marking pencil**

 **Pins or quilting clips**

 **Iron and ironing board**

 **Fusible web (recommended)**

Step 2 – Cut Every Piece

Accurate cutting is one of the most important parts of this project.

A. Background Circle

Cut:

- **1 circle**
- **Diameter: 38 cm**

Add a 1 cm seam allowance around the edge when attaching the border.

B. Chicken Appliqué Pieces

For each chicken, cut:

Body

Height:

- **15–20 cm**

Width:

- **6–8 cm**

Each body can be slightly different to give the flock personality.

Comb

Cut:

- **5 × 6 cm**

Use red fabric.

Wattle

Cut:

- **4 × 6 cm**

Use red fabric.

Beak

Cut:

- **3 × 4 cm**

Use yellow fabric.

Eye

Cut:

- **White circle**
- **Diameter: 2.5 cm**

Pupil

Cut:

- **Black circle**
- **Diameter: 1.2 cm**

C. Border Wedges

Cut:

- 16 wedges total

Measurements:

- Top width: 12.5 cm
- Bottom width: 8 cm
- Height: 15 cm

Use:

- 8 different fabrics
- Cut 2 wedges from each fabric

D. Additional Pieces

Backing:

- 45 × 45 cm

Batting:

- 45 × 45 cm

Binding:

- 5 × 110 cm

Step 3 – Arrange the Chickens

Lay the cream background circle on a flat table.

Arrange all chicken bodies before sewing.

Tips:

- Mix light and dark fabrics.
- Overlap a few chickens slightly.
- Vary their heights.
- Angle some birds slightly left or right.
- Leave enough room around the outside for attaching the border.

Do not sew anything until you're happy with the arrangement.

Take a photo if desired so nothing shifts later.

Step 4 – Appliqué the Chicken Bodies

Place each body onto the background.

If using fusible web, fuse each body first according to the manufacturer's instructions.

Sew around every body using either:

- Small zigzag stitch
- Blanket stitch

Sew slowly around curves.

Keep stitches close to the edge for a clean finish.

Step 5 – Add the Combs

Place one comb above each chicken's head.

Check that each comb looks centered.

Appliqué using the same stitch used for the bodies.

Repeat for every chicken.

Step 6 – Attach the Wattles

Position one wattle beneath every beak location.

The wattle should hang naturally below the face.

Secure each piece using:

- **Blanket stitch**
or
- **Small zigzag stitch**

Step 7 – Add the Beaks

Position each yellow beak.

Keep every beak centered.

Appliqué carefully around all edges.

Since these are small pieces, sew slowly.

Step 8 – Create the Eyes

Attach the white eye circles first.

Next, center the small black pupils on top.

You may:

- **Appliqué them**
- **Stitch by hand**
- **Use tiny satin stitches**

The eyes bring personality to each chicken, so take your time.

Step 9 – Build the Patchwork Border

Pair the wedges.

Each pair should contain two matching wedges.

Sew each pair together along the long edge using:

- **1/4" seam allowance**

After sewing:

Press all seams open.

Repeat until you have:

- **8 wedge pairs**

Now sew all eight pairs together into one complete ring.

Press every seam open.

When finished:

The border ring should measure approximately 44 cm in diameter before attaching it to the center.

Step 10 – Join the Border to the Center

Place:

Background circle

inside

the border ring.

Right sides should face together.

Match the edges carefully.

Pin generously around the entire circle.

Sew with:

- **1 cm seam allowance**

Sew slowly around the curve.

Remove pins as you sew.

After stitching:

Press the seam open.

Your quilt top is now complete.

Step 11 – Prepare the Quilt Sandwich

Layer the project in this order:

Bottom:

- **Backing fabric**
- **Right side facing down**

Middle:

- **Batting**

Top:

- **Quilt top**
- **Right side facing up**

Smooth every layer carefully.

Remove wrinkles.

Pin or baste all layers securely.

Step 12 – Quilt the Wall Hanging

Quilt only after the sandwich is completely secure.

Suggested quilting:

- **Meandering quilting**
- **Stipple quilting**

Focus quilting mainly on:

- **Cream background**

Avoid quilting directly over the appliqué pieces unless you want extra texture.

Quilt evenly across the project.

Remove all basting pins as quilting progresses.

Step 13 – Prepare the Binding

Take the:

5 × 110 cm strip

Fold it in half lengthwise.

Wrong sides together.

Press thoroughly.

This creates the double-fold binding.

Step 14 – Attach the Binding

Sew the raw edges of the binding to the front of the quilt.

Use:

- **1 cm seam allowance**

Work slowly around the curved edge.

Ease the binding gently around the circle.

Do not stretch the fabric.

Step 15 – Finish the Binding

Fold the binding over to the back.

Cover the previous stitching line.

Hand stitch the binding in place using small invisible stitches.

Alternatively, machine stitch from the front if preferred.

Press lightly once finished.

Optional Hand Embroidery

You may add decorative embroidery after quilting.

Ideas include:

 **French knots**

 **Lazy daisy flowers**

 **Small leaves**

 **Tiny vines**

 **Decorative stems**

Keep embellishments subtle so they complement the chickens.

Care Instructions

To keep your wall hanging looking beautiful:

- **Hand wash when possible.**
- **Gentle machine wash if necessary.**
- **Air dry flat.**
- **Do not bleach.**
- **Press with a warm iron if needed.**
