



# CROCHET SCARECROW DOOR HANGER

## Step-by-Step Tutorial

Bring autumn charm to your door with this cute crochet scarecrow! This project is perfect for fall decoration and beginner to intermediate crocheters.

### SIZE

Approx. 18 cm (7 inches) wide x 20 cm (8 inches) long (including hanger).

### MATERIALS

- Worsted weight yarn:
  - White (face)
  - Brown (hat & details)
  - Yellow (hair)
  - Orange (nose & flowers)
  - Black (mouth & eyes)
- 4.0 mm (G/6) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Fiberfill (optional)
- Scissors
- 2 Safety eyes (12 mm)
- Twine or yarn for hanger (approx. 15 cm)
- Stitch markers (optional)

### 1 FACE (White)

Start with a magic ring.  
**Rnd 1:** 6 sc in MR (6)  
**Rnd 2:** inc around (12)  
**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc) x6 (18)  
**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc) x6 (24)  
**Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc) x6 (30)  
**Rnd 6:** (4 sc, inc) x6 (36)  
**Rnd 7-10:** sc around (36)  
**Rnd 11:** (4 sc, dec) x6 (30)  
**Rnd 12:** (3 sc, dec) x6 (24)  
**Rnd 13:** (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)  
 Fasten off. Weave in ends.



**TIP:** Use a stitch marker at the beginning of each round and move it up as you go.

### 2 HAT (Brown)

**Rnd 1:** 6 sc in MR (6)  
**Rnd 2:** inc around (12)  
**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc) x6 (18)  
**Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc) x6 (24)  
**Rnd 5-7:** sc around (24)  
**Rnd 8:** (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)  
**Rnd 9:** sc around (18)  
 Fasten off, leave a long tail.



### BRIM (Roll style)

Ch 40. Starting in 2nd ch from hook, sc across (39). Fasten off. Sew the brim to the front loop of Rnd 7 of the hat, then roll slightly for the rolled brim look.



### 3 HAIR (Yellow)

Cut multiple strands of yellow yarn (approx. 10 cm / 4 inches each). Fold in half and use the hook to pull through the edge of the hat (front loops of Rnd 7), then pull the ends through the loop and tighten. Repeat all around for full hair.



### 4 NOSE (Orange)

**Rnd 1:** 4 sc in MR (4)  
**Rnd 2:** inc around (8)  
**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc) x4 (12)  
**Rnd 4-5:** sc around (12)  
**Rnd 6:** (sc, dec) x4 (8)  
 Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing.



### FLOWERS (Orange & Yellow)

Make 2 flowers in orange and 1 in yellow.  
 Ch 4, sl st to form a ring.  
**Rnd 1:** (ch 3, 2 dc, ch 3, sl st in ring) x5.  
 Fasten off, leave a tail. Sew to hat.



### 5 ASSEMBLY (Face Details)

- Attach safety eyes between Rnds 7-8, about 6 sts apart.
- Sew the nose in the center between the eyes.
- Embroider the mouth using black yarn: make a wide smile and vertical stitches across like a scarecrow.
- Add small orange freckles (optional) using French knots.



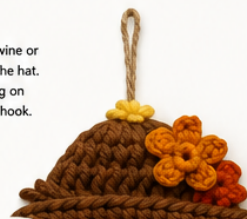
### 6 HAT EMBELLISHMENT

Sew the flowers on one side of the hat. Add a small yellow flower on top if desired.



### 7 HANGER

Attach a piece of twine or yarn to the top of the hat. Tie a knot and hang on your door knob or hook.



### FINISHED LOOK

Your Crochet Scarecrow Door Hanger is ready to welcome fall!



### COLOR GUIDE

- White – Face
- Brown – Hat & details
- Yellow – Hair & small flower
- Orange – Nose & flowers
- Black – Eyes & mouth

### CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Spot clean gently with mild soap and water. Lay flat to dry.

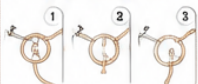


### TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- Keep your stitches tight and even for a neat look.
- Use stitch markers to stay on track.
- Weave in all ends securely.
- Block the pieces lightly if needed.

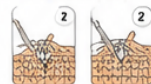

Approx. 18 cm (7 in)

string) x 18 cm (7 in) wide

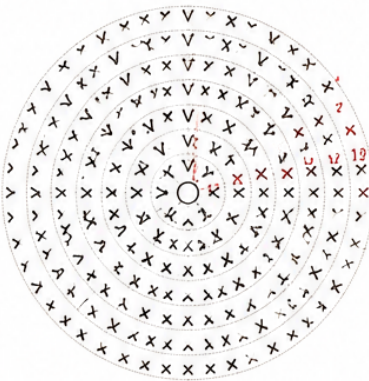
## MATERIALS

- Worsted weight yarn:  
Cream, Brown, Yellow,  
Orange, Black
- 4.0 mm (G) crochet hook
- Black safety eyes (12 mm)
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker
- Scissors
- Twine or yarn for hanger

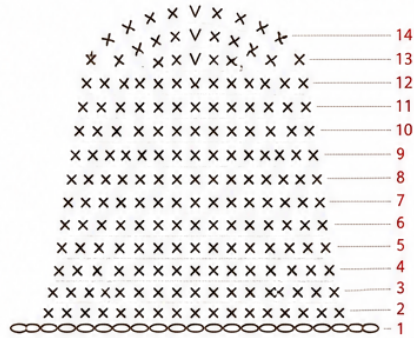
## 1. FACE (Make 1) – Cream



- Rnd 1: Magic ring, 6 sc (6)  
 Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc) x 6 (18)  
 Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)  
 Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)  
 Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)  
 Rnd 7: (5 sc, inc) x 6 (42)  
 Rnd 8: (6 sc, inc) x 6 (48)  
 Rnd 9: (7 sc, inc) x 6 (54)  
 Rnd 10: (8 sc, inc) x 6 (60)  
 Rnd 11–12: Sc in each st (60)  
 Fasten off.

Embroider mouth with  
black yarn as shown.  
Sew on eyes and nose.

## 2. HAT (Make 1) – Brown



- Rnd 1: Magic ring, 6 sc (6)  
 Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st (12)  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc) x 6 (18)  
 Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 (24)  
 Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 (30)  
 Rnd 6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 (36)  
 Rnd 7–12: Sc in each st (36)  
 Rnd 13: (5 sc, dec) x 6 (30)  
 Rnd 14: (3 sc, dec) x 6 (24)

### Brim:

Ch 1, work in FLO:  
Sc in each st around.  
Fasten off.

## 3. HAIR (Cut 12 pieces) – Yellow

Ch 18, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch  
across. Fasten off. Cut yarn.



## 4. FLOWERS (Make 2) – Orange (Large)



## 5. FLOWER (Make 1) – Yellow (Small)



## FLOWER INSTRUCTIONS

Rnd 1: Magic ring, ch 1,  
(sc, ch 2, sc) x 5, sl st to  
first sc. Fasten off.

## 6. NOSE – Orange



- Rnd 1: Magic ring, 3 sc  
 Rnd 2: 3 inc  
 Rnd 3: (sc, inc) x 3  
 Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc) x 3  
 Rnd 5: (3 sc, inc) x 3  
 Rnd 6: Sc in each st  
 Fasten off.  
 Sew to center of face.

## 7. TOP FLOWER (Small Yellow)

Make as Flower (Small).



## 8. NECK STRAW / FRINGE – Brown

Cut 6–8 strands of brown  
yarn (approx. 10 cm each).  
Fold in half and knot  
under the face.



## ASSEMBLY

- Sew hat on top of the face.
- Attach hair under the brim  
(6 strands on each side).
- Sew large orange flower  
and small yellow flower  
on hat.
- Sew small orange flower  
on the side of the face.
- Sew top yellow flower on  
top of the hat.
- Attach twine/yarn hanger  
at the top.

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## Crochet Scarecrow Door Hanger – Complete Step-by-Step Tutorial

Bring a cheerful touch of fall to your home with this Crochet Scarecrow Door Hanger. This project combines simple amigurumi-style crochet, yarn hair, embroidered facial details, small crochet flowers, and a rustic hanging loop to create a charming decoration for a door, wall, cabinet knob, or seasonal display.

The tutorial below follows the construction, stitch counts, colors, and assembly shown in the reference chart. All crochet terminology is written in US crochet terms, with both centimeters and inches included where useful.

This project is best suited to an advanced beginner to intermediate crocheter who is comfortable working in a magic ring, crocheting in continuous rounds, increasing, decreasing, sewing crochet pieces together, and doing a small amount of embroidery.

Finished size: approximately 18 cm (7 inches) wide × 20 cm (8 inches) long, including the hanger.



### Materials You Will Need

Gather all of your supplies before beginning.

You will need:

- Worsted-weight yarn in white for the face
- Worsted-weight yarn in brown for the hat and brown decorative details

- Worsted-weight yarn in yellow for the hair and yellow flower
- Worsted-weight yarn in orange for the nose, freckles, and flowers
- Worsted-weight yarn in black for the mouth and facial embroidery
- 4.0 mm (G/6) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Two 12 mm safety eyes
- Approximately 15 cm (6 inches) of twine or yarn for the hanger
- Stitch markers, optional but strongly recommended
- A small amount of fiberfill, optional

An exact gauge is not specified for this project. The most important thing is to crochet with stitches that are firm and even so the face and hat maintain their shape.

If your stitches are naturally loose, you may want to use a slightly smaller crochet hook. If your stitches are extremely tight, work more gently rather than increasing the hook size too much.

## Crochet Abbreviations – US Terms

The pattern uses standard American crochet terminology.

**MR – Magic Ring:** An adjustable loop used to begin crocheting in the round.

**ch – Chain:** Yarn over and pull the yarn through the loop already on your hook.

**sl st – Slip Stitch:** Insert the hook into the indicated stitch, yarn over, and pull the yarn through both the stitch and the loop on your hook.

**sc – Single Crochet:** Insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over again, and pull through both loops.

**dc – Double Crochet:** Yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over and pull through two loops, then yarn over and pull through the final two loops.

**hdc – Half Double Crochet:** Yarn over, insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop, then yarn over and pull through all three loops.

**tr – Treble Crochet:** Yarn over twice, insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop, then work through the loops two at a time until one loop remains.

**inc – Increase:** Work 2 single crochet stitches into the same stitch.

**dec – Decrease:** Crochet two stitches together to turn two stitches into one. An invisible decrease works especially well for this project.

**BLO – Back Loop Only:** Crochet only through the back loop of the stitch.

**FLO – Front Loop Only:** Crochet only through the front loop of the stitch.

The number shown in parentheses at the end of a round indicates the total stitch count after completing that round.

## **How to Make a Magic Ring**

Several pieces begin with a magic ring.

Wrap the yarn around your fingers to create an adjustable loop.

Insert your crochet hook through the loop and catch the working yarn.

Pull the yarn through the loop.

Chain one if necessary to secure the ring.

Work the required number of stitches directly into the center of the ring.

When the required stitches are complete, gently pull the yarn tail until the center closes tightly.

The face, hat, and nose all begin using this method.



## **Step 1: Crochet the White Scarecrow Face**

Use white worsted-weight yarn and the 4.0 mm crochet hook.

The face is worked in continuous rounds. Do not join with a slip stitch unless you personally prefer working joined rounds.

Place a stitch marker in the first stitch of every round. Move the marker upward as you work.

Start with a magic ring.

**Round 1: Work 6 sc into the MR. (6)**

Pull the magic ring closed.

**Round 2: Work 2 sc in every stitch around. (12)**

This means you are making an increase in every stitch.

**Round 3: Repeat [1 sc, inc] 6 times. (18)**

**Round 4: Repeat [2 sc, inc] 6 times. (24)**

**Round 5: Repeat [3 sc, inc] 6 times. (30)**

**Round 6: Repeat [4 sc, inc] 6 times. (36)**

The face should now have a smooth circular shape.

**Rounds 7–10: Sc in every stitch around. (36 stitches per round)**

These straight rounds give the face a little depth and create the area where the eyes, nose, and embroidered smile will be positioned.

**Round 11: Repeat [4 sc, dec] 6 times. (30)**

**Round 12: Repeat [3 sc, dec] 6 times. (24)**

**Round 13: Repeat [2 sc, dec] 6 times. (18)**

Fasten off and weave in the end as appropriate for your assembly method.

If you would like the face to have a slightly fuller, dimensional appearance, add a small amount of fiberfill before completing the decreasing section. Do not overstuff it. The finished scarecrow should remain relatively flat so it hangs comfortably against a door.

Try to keep all increases and decreases evenly spaced. This prevents the face from becoming angular.

## **Step 2: Position the Safety Eyes**

Before permanently closing or covering the back of the face, position the safety eyes.

Place the two 12 mm safety eyes between Rounds 7 and 8.

Leave approximately 6 stitches between the eyes.

Before attaching the washers permanently, place both eyes temporarily and look at the front of the face.

They should appear centered horizontally.

Once you are happy with the position, push the safety-eye washers securely onto the posts from the back.

If this decoration will be accessible to very young children or pets, embroidered eyes can be substituted for plastic safety eyes.

### **Step 3: Crochet the Brown Scarecrow Hat**

Use brown worsted-weight yarn.

Begin with a magic ring.

Round 1: Work 6 sc into the MR. (6)

Round 2: Inc in every stitch around. (12)

Round 3: Repeat [1 sc, inc] 6 times. (18)

Round 4: Repeat [2 sc, inc] 6 times. (24)

Rounds 5–7: Sc in every stitch around. (24 stitches per round)

These rounds create the crown of the scarecrow hat.

Round 8: Repeat [2 sc, dec] 6 times. (18)

Round 9: Sc in every stitch around. (18)

Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

Gently shape the hat with your fingers. The crown should look slightly rounded rather than stiff or perfectly symmetrical. A little irregularity contributes to the rustic scarecrow appearance.

### **Step 4: Make the Rolled Hat Brim**

The brim is crocheted separately and then attached to the front of the hat.

Using brown yarn:

Chain 40.

Beginning in the second chain from the hook, work 1 sc into each chain across.

You should have 39 sc.

Fasten off, leaving enough yarn for sewing.

Position this strip across the lower front portion of the hat.

According to the reference construction, sew the brim to the front loop area around Round 7 of the hat.

As you attach it, allow the strip to curve naturally around the front.

After sewing, gently roll or fold the brim slightly upward to create the thick rolled-brim appearance shown in the finished scarecrow.

Do not flatten it completely. The raised brim is an important part of the design.

## Step 5: Add the Yellow Yarn Hair

Cut multiple pieces of yellow yarn approximately 10 cm (4 inches) long.

You will need enough strands to form hair across the lower edge of the hat.

Take one strand and fold it exactly or approximately in half.

Insert your crochet hook through the edge of the hat near the front-loop area around Round 7.

Catch the folded center of the yellow strand with the crochet hook.

Pull the folded loop partway through the hat.

Insert the two loose ends of the yarn through that loop.

Pull gently to tighten.

This creates a simple lark's-head style knot.

Repeat with additional yellow strands across the desired area.

Continue until the scarecrow has a full fringe of yellow hair.

Once all strands are attached, use scissors to trim the ends if needed.

Avoid making the hair perfectly even. Slightly varied lengths create the loose straw-like appearance of a traditional scarecrow.

The finished hair should extend from underneath the hat and frame both sides of the face.

## Step 6: Crochet the Orange Nose

Use orange worsted-weight yarn.

Begin with a magic ring.

Round 1: Work 4 sc into the MR. (4)

Round 2: Inc in every stitch around. (8)

Round 3: Repeat [1 sc, inc] 4 times. (12)

Rounds 4–5: Sc in every stitch around. (12 stitches per round)

**Round 6: Repeat [1 sc, dec] 4 times. (8)**

**Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.**

**Use your fingers to shape the nose into the slightly pointed, carrot-like form shown in the reference.**

**Position the nose in the center of the face, directly between and slightly below the eyes.**

**Use the long orange yarn tail and a yarn needle to sew around the edge of the nose.**

**Make small, evenly spaced stitches so the attachment is secure but not bulky.**

**Before making the final sewing stitches, you may add a tiny amount of fiberfill underneath the nose if you want it to stand out more prominently.**

## **♥ Step 7: Embroider the Scarecrow Smile**

**Thread a yarn needle with black yarn.**

**Begin by creating a large curved smile across the lower portion of the face.**

**The smile should extend broadly toward both sides of the face.**

**Make the line using several controlled stitches rather than trying to create the entire curve with one extremely long strand.**

**Once the curved mouth is complete, add short vertical stitches across the smile line.**

**These stitches imitate the traditional sewn or patched mouth of a scarecrow.**

**Space them irregularly but attractively along the smile.**

You can also place a small angled stitch near each end of the mouth to emphasize the rustic stitched expression.

Keep the embroidery relaxed. Pulling the black yarn too tightly can distort the crocheted face.

## Step 8: Add Optional Orange Freckles

The tutorial graphic includes small orange facial accents.

Thread your yarn needle with orange yarn.

Add several tiny freckles beside the nose using French knots.

To make a French knot, bring the needle from the back of the crochet fabric to the front.

Wrap the yarn around the needle one or two times.

Hold the wraps gently against the surface.

Insert the needle back into the crochet fabric very close to the point where the yarn emerged.

Pull the yarn carefully through while maintaining slight tension on the wraps.

The yarn should form a small raised knot.

Add a few freckles to each cheek.

These freckles are optional, but they add warmth and character to the finished scarecrow.

## Step 9: Crochet the Small Flowers

The reference tutorial uses two orange flowers and one yellow flower for the main hat decoration.

For each flower, begin with the appropriate yarn color.

**Chain 4.**

**Join to the first chain with a sl st to form a small ring.**

**Work the following petal sequence into the ring:**

**[ch 3, 2 dc into the ring, ch 3, sl st into the ring]**

**Repeat this sequence a total of 5 times.**

**You will have five petals.**

**Fasten off, leaving a tail long enough for sewing the flower to the hat.**

**Make:**

- **2 flowers in orange**
- **1 flower in yellow**

**Gently spread the petals with your fingers after fastening off.**

**The flowers do not need to be perfectly identical. Their handmade appearance works beautifully with the scarecrow theme.**

## **Step 10: Decorate the Hat**

**Place the crocheted flowers along one side of the brown hat, following the general placement shown in the reference image.**

**Arrange the two orange flowers together so that they overlap slightly rather than appearing separated.**

**Position the yellow flower higher on the hat as a small contrasting accent.**

**Thread each flower tail onto your yarn needle and sew the center and a few portions of the petals securely to the hat.**

Do not sew every millimeter of every petal flat. Leaving the outer parts of the petals slightly raised produces more texture.

After sewing, weave the yarn tails into the inside of the hat.

The tutorial also allows for a small additional yellow flower on top if desired. This is optional and can be used if you want a fuller floral arrangement.



## **Step 11: Assemble the Hat and Face**

Place the completed hat over the upper portion of the scarecrow face.

Allow the yellow hair to fall naturally across the sides.

The brown rolled brim should sit slightly above the eyes without covering them.

Adjust the angle until the hat resembles the reference design.

Using the long brown yarn tail and a yarn needle, sew the hat securely to the face.

Work through small portions of the hat and corresponding stitches of the face.

Try to keep the stitches hidden underneath the brim whenever possible.

Sew across enough of the hat to prevent it from shifting while hanging.

Check the scarecrow from the front several times during sewing to make sure the hat has not become crooked.

After the hat is secure, weave the remaining brown yarn end into the back of the project.



## **Step 12: Make the Hanging Loop**

**Cut approximately 15 cm (6 inches) of twine or sturdy yarn.**

**Fold it to form a loop.**

**Position the two ends at the top center of the hat.**

**Tie the ends securely together or sew them firmly into the crochet fabric.**

**The loop should be centered so the scarecrow hangs straight.**

**Pull gently on the hanger before using it to make sure it is securely attached.**

**If you plan to hang the scarecrow from a large doorknob, you can make the loop slightly larger.**

**If it will hang from a small hook or nail, a shorter loop may work better.**

**The reference finished measurement of approximately 20 cm (8 inches) long includes the hanging portion.**



## **How to Make a Single Crochet**

**Insert your hook into the next stitch.**

**Yarn over.**

**Pull the yarn through the stitch. You now have two loops on the hook.**

**Yarn over again.**

**Pull through both loops.**

**One single crochet is complete.**

Most of the scarecrow is made using this basic stitch, so keeping your single crochets consistent is important.

## **✚ How to Crochet an Increase**

An increase makes the piece wider.

Insert your hook into the indicated stitch and make one sc.

Insert your hook into the same stitch again and make another sc.

You have now worked 2 sc in one stitch.

In the pattern, this is abbreviated as inc.

The increases in the first rounds of the face and hat create their circular shapes.

## **— How to Crochet a Decrease**

A decrease combines two stitches into one.

For the neatest result, use an invisible decrease.

Insert the hook under the front loop of the first stitch.

Without completing a stitch, insert the hook under the front loop of the next stitch.

Yarn over and pull through the front loops.

Yarn over again and pull through the remaining loops on the hook.

One decrease is complete.

The abbreviation is dec.

Decreases are used in the later face rounds, the hat, and the nose.



### **Step 13: Weave In All Yarn Ends**

**After completing the assembly, inspect the back of the scarecrow.**

**Thread each loose yarn end through a yarn needle.**

**Weave the yarn through several nearby stitches.**

**Change direction once or twice so the yarn cannot easily pull out.**

**Trim the remaining yarn close to the crochet fabric.**

**Be especially careful with the ends attached to the eyes, nose, mouth, flowers, hat, and hanging loop.**

**A clean back gives the finished decoration a more professional appearance and helps the pieces remain secure during storage.**



### **Step 14: Shape and Finish the Scarecrow**

**Place the completed scarecrow on a flat surface.**

**Use your fingers to gently reshape the face into a smooth circle.**

**Adjust the hat so the crown is rounded.**

**Lift the rolled brim slightly.**

**Separate and arrange the yellow hair strands.**

**Fluff the crochet flower petals.**

**Straighten the embroidered smile if necessary by gently manipulating the surrounding stitches.**

**Make sure the nose remains centered between the eyes.**

**Check that the hanging loop is centered at the top.**

**Your Crochet Scarecrow Door Hanger should now have a friendly white face, black eyes, orange nose, stitched smile, yellow yarn hair, brown hat, autumn-colored flowers, and rustic hanging loop.**

## **Color Guide**

**To stay consistent with the original tutorial, use the following color arrangement:**

**White: Scarecrow face**

**Brown: Hat, brim, and brown decorative details**

**Yellow: Hair and small yellow flower**

**Orange: Nose, flowers, and optional freckles**

**Black: Eyes and embroidered mouth**

**You can substitute slightly different shades while keeping the same color family. Warm mustard yellow, pumpkin orange, cream white, and chocolate brown work especially well for an autumn appearance.**

## **Tips for Success**

**Keep your stitches tight and even to give the scarecrow a neat, structured appearance.**

**Use a stitch marker at the beginning of every continuous round. This is especially useful on the face and hat because it is easy to lose track of the beginning of a round.**

**Count your stitches at the end of every round.**

**Do not wait several rounds before checking your stitch count. Fixing a mistake immediately is much easier than unraveling several completed rounds.**

**When sewing pieces together, take small stitches and check the front frequently.**

**Do not pull embroidered facial features too tightly.**

**Secure and weave in all yarn ends carefully.**

**If any portion of the project develops small gaps, use your hook to redistribute the surrounding stitches rather than pulling individual stitches excessively tight.**

**Block or gently shape the pieces if needed before final assembly.**



## **Care Instructions**

**This handmade decoration should be cleaned gently.**

**For small marks, spot clean with mild soap and water.**

**Avoid aggressive scrubbing because it can cause the yarn fibers to become fuzzy.**

**Blot excess water with a clean towel.**

**Reshape the scarecrow while it is damp.**

**Lay it flat to dry completely.**

**Avoid hanging the project while it is soaking wet because the weight of the water can stretch the crochet stitches and hanging loop.**

**If your decoration contains plastic safety eyes or decorative twine, avoid high heat.**



## Finished Look

Your finished Crochet Scarecrow Door Hanger is now ready to welcome fall.

Hang it from a door knob, decorative wall hook, cabinet handle, peg, or other secure location.

The completed design should feature a softly rounded white face framed by yellow yarn hair, a textured brown scarecrow hat with a rolled brim, orange and yellow crochet flowers, two black eyes, a dimensional orange nose, orange freckles, and a large black stitched smile.

The approximately 18 cm × 20 cm (7 × 8 inch) finished size makes it large enough to be noticeable without becoming heavy or bulky.

For the closest match to the original tutorial, keep the face white, use rich brown for the hat, bright yellow for the straw-like hair, pumpkin orange for the nose and flowers, and black for the cheerful stitched facial details.

Once every yarn tail is secured and the hanging loop has been tested, your handmade scarecrow is complete and ready for autumn decorating. 🍂🧶

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
