

CROCHET ZIPPER POUCH

with Rose Flower, Leaves, Pearls and Tassel

Step-by-step Tutorial in US Terms



FINISHED SIZE

Approx. 20 cm (8") wide
x 13 cm (5") high

MATERIALS

- Worsted weight cotton yarn
 - Light purple (MC) – about 80 g
 - Dark purple (CC) – about 50 g
- 2.5 mm (US B) crochet hook
- 20 cm (8") zipper
- Faux pearls (6 mm) – about 20 pcs
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch marker
- Fabric glue (optional)

ABBREVIATIONS (US TERMS)

ch	chain
sl st	slip stitch
sc	single crochet
hdc	half double crochet
dc	double crochet

inc	increase (2 sc in same st)

1. BOTTOM PANEL (MC – light purple)

Ch 21.

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and across. (20 sc)

Rows 2–34: ch 1, turn, sc across. (20 sc)
Fasten off.



2. UPPER PANEL (CC – dark purple)

Join CC on top edge.

Row 1: ch 1, sc across. (20 sc)

Rows 2–16: ch 1, turn, sc across. (20 sc)

Fasten off.



3. JOIN PANELS

Your piece should measure about 20 cm wide x 13 cm high.



4. PEARL TRIM

Use fabric glue or sew the pearls along the join seam.



5. ROSE FLOWER

Make in light purple.

Ch 51.

Row 1: 3 dc in 4th ch from hook, [sl st in next ch, 3 dc in next ch] across.

Roll the strip into a spiral and sew the base.



6. LEAVES (make 2)

Make in dark purple.

Ch 11.

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch, hdc in next, dc in next 2, hdc in next, sc in next, sl st in next, sc in last.

Fasten off and sew leaves behind the rose.



7. ATTACH FLOWER & LEAVES

Sew the rose and leaves onto the upper panel.



8. TASSEL

Wrap yarn around a 4–5 cm cardboard piece about 50 times. Tie a strand tightly at the top, cut the loops at the bottom. Wrap another strand 1 cm below the top to form the tassel head. Attach to the zipper pull.

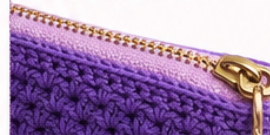


9. ZIPPER INSTALLATION

Place zipper along the top edge, right sides together.

Sew with a zipper foot or whip stitch.

Turn pouch right side out.



10. FINISHED!

Your beautiful zipper pouch is ready to use!



MAIN STITCHES USED (US TERMS)

chain (ch)

single crochet (sc)

half double crochet (hdc)

double crochet (dc)

treble crochet (tr)

slip stitch (sl st)



TIPS

- Keep your stitches tight and even for a neat look.
- You can use fabric glue to secure pearls and flower for extra strength.
- Block your pieces lightly for a professional finish.

CROCHET ZIPPER POUCH WITH FLOWER PATTERN DIAGRAM

MATERIALS

- Worsted weight cotton yarn
 - Light purple (main pouch)
 - Medium purple (top band, flower)
 - Dark purple (leaves, tassel wrap)
- 3.0 mm (D/3) crochet hook
- Zipper (approx. 20 cm / 8 in)
- Pearl beads
- Yarn needle, scissors

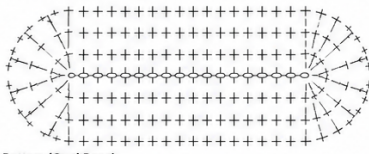
Approx.
Width: 20 cm (8 in)
Height: 14 cm (5½ in)

STITCH LEGEND (US TERMS)

- Chain (ch)
- Slip stitch (sl st)
- + Single crochet (sc)
- ⏏ Half double crochet (hdc)
- ⏏ Double crochet (dc)
- ⏏ Treble crochet (tr)
- ∇ 2 dc in same stitch (increase)
- △ 2 dc together (decrease)
- ⏏ Front post double crochet (fpdc)
- ⏏ Back post double crochet (bpdc)

1. POUCH BODY (MAIN COLOR – LIGHT PURPLE)

Work in continuous rounds.



Bottom (Oval Base)

Ch 21

Rnd 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and across (20 sc), 3 sc in last ch, continue on the other side of the chain: 19 sc, 2 sc in last ch. (44 sc)

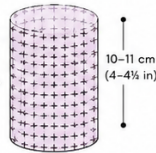
Rnd 2: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 19 sts, 2 sc in next 3 sts, sc in next 19 sts, 2 sc in next 2 sts. (48 sc)

Rnd 3: Sc in BLO around. (48 sc)

Sides

Work in sc in continuous rounds.

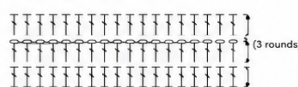
Rnd 4-27: Sc in each st around. Fasten off.



2. TOP BAND (MEDIUM PURPLE)

Join yarn at top edge.

Rnd 1-3: Work in fpdc around.



3. PEARL BEAD ROW

String pearls on yarn with a yarn needle.

Sew the row of pearls along the join between top band and body.



4. FLOWER (MEDIUM & LIGHT PURPLE)

Make 1 flower.

Center

With medium purple: Ch 4, sl st to first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, 8 sc in ring, sl st to join. (8 sc)

Rnd 2 (Petals): Ch 1, (sc, hdc, 2 dc, hdc, sc, sl st) in next st, sl st in next st. Repeat around. (8 petals)

Rnd 3 (Outer Petals): Join light purple in back loop of petals from Rnd 2. (Sc, hdc, 2 dc, hdc, sc, sl st) in same st, sl st in next st. Repeat around. Fasten off and sew to pouch.

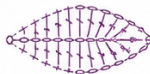


5. LEAVES (DARK PURPLE) – Make 2

Ch 10

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc, 2 dc, hdc, sc, sl st, sc, hdc, 2 dc, hdc, sc. (11 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sl st, sc, hdc, dc, tr, dc, hdc, sc, sl st. Fasten off leaving a long tail. Sew leaves behind the flower.



6. TASSEL

Wrap yarn around a 12 cm (4½ in) book or cardboard about 40 times.

Cut one side and tie a strand tightly around the top.

Wrap another strand around 1.5 cm (½ in) below the top and knot. Attach to zipper pull.



7. ZIPPER FINISH

Sew the zipper to the top edge of the pouch.



ASSEMBLY

- ✓ Sew flower and leaves to the front.
- ✓ Sew pearl row across the join of top band and body.
- ✓ Attach tassel to zipper.
- ✓ Weave in all ends.

Crochet Zipper Pouch with Rose Flower, Leaves, Pearls and Tassel 🌹

This Crochet Zipper Pouch is a beautiful handmade accessory featuring two shades of purple, a dimensional crochet rose, decorative leaves, faux pearls, a zipper, and a matching yarn tassel. The finished pouch is approximately 20 cm (8 inches) wide × 13 cm (5 inches) high.

The tutorial below follows the construction, stitch counts, measurements, and decorative details shown in the original chart. All crochet terminology is written in US terms, making the instructions easy to follow for crocheters in the United States.

The pouch is worked primarily in single crochet, making the basic construction approachable even for someone who has limited crochet experience. The flower, leaves, pearl trim, tassel, and zipper are added afterward to create the finished decorative look.

Materials You Will Need

Prepare all your materials before beginning the project.

You will need:

- Worsted weight cotton yarn
 - Light purple — approximately 80 g
 - Dark purple — approximately 50 g
- 2.5 mm crochet hook — US size B
- 20 cm (8-inch) zipper
- Approximately 20 faux pearls, 6 mm each
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch marker
- Fabric glue, optional

The light purple yarn is used for the bottom section of the pouch, while the dark purple yarn creates the upper section.

A matching or coordinating thread can also be useful when attaching the zipper and pearls, although the original tutorial allows the pearls to be either sewn or secured with fabric glue.

Crochet Abbreviations — US Terms

The following abbreviations are used throughout this project:

ch — chain

sl st — slip stitch

sc — single crochet

hdc — half double crochet

dc — double crochet

tr — treble crochet

inc — increase, or work 2 single crochet stitches in the same stitch

dec — decrease, or sc2tog

FO — fasten off

Although several basic crochet stitches are included in the stitch reference of the original tutorial, the pouch body itself is primarily made with single crochet.

Basic Crochet Stitches Used

Before starting the pouch, it helps to understand the principal stitches.

To make a chain stitch (ch), create a slip knot on your hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through the loop already on your hook. Repeat until you have the required number of chains.

To make a single crochet (sc), insert your hook into the indicated stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop. You will have two loops on the hook. Yarn over again and pull through both loops.

To make a half double crochet (hdc), yarn over, insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop. Yarn over and pull through all three loops on the hook.

To make a double crochet (dc), yarn over, insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over, and pull up a loop. Yarn over and pull

through two loops. Yarn over once more and pull through the remaining two loops.

To make a treble crochet (tr), yarn over twice before inserting your hook into the stitch. Yarn over and pull up a loop. Then yarn over and pull through two loops at a time until only one loop remains.

For a slip stitch (sl st), insert the hook into the required stitch, yarn over, and pull the yarn through both the stitch and the loop already on your hook.

Step 1: Crochet the Bottom Panel in Light Purple

Begin with the light purple yarn, which is labeled MC, or Main Color, in the original tutorial.

Make a foundation chain of:

Ch 21.

You will begin working into this foundation chain to create the rectangular bottom section of the pouch.

Row 1

Insert your hook into the second chain from the hook.

Work:

1 sc in the second chain from the hook and 1 sc in every remaining chain across.

You should have:

20 sc.

Keeping the stitch count at 20 is important because it determines the width of the pouch.

Rows 2–34

At the beginning of every row:

Ch 1 and turn.

Then work:

1 sc in each stitch across.

You should continue to have:

20 sc in every row.

Repeat this simple single crochet row until you have completed Row 34.

Fasten off after completing Row 34.

Because this section contains many rows of single crochet, periodically count your stitches. Accidentally skipping the first or last stitch could gradually make the rectangle narrower.

Try to maintain comfortable, even tension so that the fabric remains flat rather than curling excessively.

Step 2: Crochet the Upper Panel in Dark Purple

Now change to the dark purple yarn, identified as CC, or Contrast Color.

According to the original tutorial, join the dark purple yarn along the top edge of the light purple section.

Row 1

Join the dark purple yarn.

Ch 1.

Work:

1 sc in each stitch across.

You should have:

20 sc.

Rows 2–16

At the beginning of each row:

Ch 1 and turn.

Then:

Sc across.

Maintain:

20 sc per row.

Continue until you have completed 16 rows of the dark purple upper section.

Fasten off.

You should now have a two-color rectangular piece with a light purple lower portion and a dark purple upper portion.

Step 3: Check the Size and Prepare the Pouch Body

Once the two-color section has been completed, check the approximate dimensions.

The piece should measure approximately:

20 cm (8 inches) wide × 13 cm (5 inches) high.

Small variations can occur depending on yarn, hook size, and personal crochet tension.

The original tutorial uses these measurements as the target finished dimensions.

Before continuing, gently smooth the crochet fabric on a flat surface. Make sure the edges are reasonably straight and that the top edge is suitable for attaching the zipper.

If necessary, lightly block the crochet piece before assembly. Avoid stretching it beyond the intended size.

Step 4: Add the Pearl Trim

The pearl embellishment is placed along the horizontal area where the light purple and dark purple sections meet.

Use approximately 20 faux pearls measuring 6 mm each.

Position the pearls in a neat horizontal row along the joining seam.

You have two options shown in the tutorial.

You can sew the pearls securely in place using a needle and coordinating thread or yarn.

Alternatively, you may use fabric glue.

For a pouch that will receive regular use, sewing the pearls is generally the more secure method.

Start at one side and continue across, keeping the spacing between each pearl as even as possible.

Do not pull your sewing thread too tightly because this may distort the crochet fabric.

When finished, secure the thread carefully on the inside.

Step 5: Crochet the Rose Flower

The large dimensional rose is one of the main decorative features of the pouch.

Use the light purple yarn.

Begin with:

Ch 51.

This long chain will form the base of the flower strip.

Rose Row 1

Work:

3 dc in the 4th chain from the hook.

Then repeat the following sequence across the chain:

[sl st in next ch, 3 dc in next ch]

Continue this pattern across.

The alternating groups of double crochet stitches and slip stitches cause the strip to naturally curve and form petal-like sections.

Once the crochet strip has been completed, fasten off while leaving enough yarn for assembly.

Step 6: Shape the Crochet Strip into a Rose

Lay the completed flower strip in front of you.

Beginning at one end, start rolling the strip inward.

Roll it into a spiral, arranging the crocheted sections so that they resemble overlapping rose petals.

Keep the center relatively tight.

As the rose becomes larger, allow the outer petals to sit slightly more openly.

When you are satisfied with the flower shape, thread the yarn tail onto your yarn needle.

Sew through the bottom layers of the flower several times to secure the spiral.

The stitches should pass through several layers at the base without flattening the petals on the front.

Secure the yarn firmly and weave in the end.

You should now have a dimensional crochet rose similar to the flower shown on the pouch.

Step 7: Crochet the Leaves 🌿

Make 2 leaves using the dark purple yarn.

For each leaf:

Ch 11.

Leaf Row 1

Beginning in the second chain from the hook, work the stitch sequence provided in the original tutorial:

sc in 2nd ch, hdc in next, dc in next 2, hdc in next, sc in next, sl st in next, sc in last.

Fasten off.

Leave a yarn tail long enough to sew the leaf onto the pouch.

Make the second leaf in exactly the same way.

Because the leaves are relatively small, keep your stitches neat and even.

Gently shape each leaf with your fingers after fastening off.

Step 8: Arrange the Rose and Leaves

Place the completed rose onto the dark purple upper section of the pouch.

The original design positions the flower slightly off-center rather than directly in the middle.

Arrange the two dark purple leaves beside the rose.

One leaf can angle slightly upward while the second can point outward or downward, recreating the natural floral arrangement shown in the tutorial.

Experiment with the positioning before sewing anything permanently.

The flower should sit above the pearl trim, with the leaves extending behind or beside it.

Once you like the arrangement, secure the pieces temporarily with stitch markers or pins if needed.

Step 9: Attach the Flower and Leaves

Thread the yarn tail from one leaf onto your yarn needle.

Sew the leaf securely to the dark purple upper panel.

Try to keep the attachment stitches hidden within the crochet texture.

Attach the second leaf in the same way.

Next, position the rose over the ends of the leaves.

Using the yarn tail from the flower or a separate piece of matching yarn, sew through the base of the rose and into the pouch fabric.

Work around several points at the bottom of the flower.

The rose should be firmly attached but should retain its three-dimensional appearance.

Do not stitch through every petal because the petals should remain raised.

After everything is secure, weave in the remaining yarn ends.

Step 10: Make the Yarn Tassel

Use the light purple yarn for the tassel.

You will need a piece of cardboard approximately:

4–5 cm wide.

Wrap the yarn around the cardboard approximately:

50 times.

Try to keep the wraps together and evenly aligned.

Cut a separate piece of yarn and slide it underneath the wrapped yarn at one end.

Tie it tightly at the top.

This creates the hanging point of the tassel.

Carefully slide the wrapped yarn off the cardboard.

Use scissors to cut through all the loops at the bottom.

You will now have the basic tassel shape.

Step 11: Form the Tassel Head

Cut another strand of yarn.

Approximately 1 cm below the top, wrap this strand several times around the tassel.

Pull the wrapping firmly enough to create a defined tassel head.

Tie the strand securely.

Use your yarn needle to hide the ends inside the tassel.

Straighten the strands with your fingers.

If necessary, trim the bottom lightly with scissors so that all the yarn ends are approximately the same length.

Do not over-trim, as the finished tassel should remain full and decorative.

Step 12: Attach the Tassel to the Zipper Pull

Use the secured top loop of the tassel to attach it to the zipper pull.

Make sure the attachment is strong because the tassel may be handled whenever the pouch is opened or closed.

The finished tassel should hang freely beside the pouch.

In the original design, the tassel coordinates with the light purple bottom section and balances the large crochet flower on the front.

Step 13: Prepare the 8-Inch Zipper

Use the 20 cm (8-inch) zipper listed in the materials.

Before sewing, place the zipper along the top edge of the pouch.

Check that the zipper is centered.

The zipper pull should move freely without catching on the crochet fabric.

You may use sewing clips, pins, or temporary stitches to keep the zipper in position while you work.

Be careful when using conventional pins because they can easily pass through the open areas of crochet fabric.

Step 14: Install the Zipper

The tutorial instructs you to place the zipper along the top edge with the right sides together.

Position it carefully.

Sew the zipper into place using either:

- A sewing machine with a zipper foot, or
- A neat whip stitch by hand

When hand-sewing, make small, consistent stitches through the zipper tape and the edge of the crochet.

Avoid pulling the thread excessively tight.

Too much tension could gather the crochet edge and make the zipper wavy.

Continue until the zipper is securely attached.

Repeat as necessary for the opposite side of the zipper so that the pouch can open and close correctly.

Step 15: Turn the Pouch Right Side Out

After the zipper has been installed and the pouch construction is complete, turn the pouch right side out.

Gently push the corners into shape with your fingers.

Do not use sharp tools to push the corners because they could damage the crochet stitches.

Smooth the front and check the placement of the rose, leaves, pearl trim, and zipper.

Open and close the zipper several times.

It should move smoothly without catching on yarn or decorative elements.

Step 16: Final Finishing ✨

Inspect the entire pouch carefully.

Check that all yarn tails have been woven in.

Make sure the pearls are firmly secured.

Check that both leaves are attached properly.

Gently reshape the rose petals if they became compressed during construction.

Straighten the tassel and trim any noticeably uneven strands.

Check the zipper stitching one more time, especially around both ends.

The finished pouch should measure approximately 20 cm (8 inches) wide × 13 cm (5 inches) high.

Blocking the Finished Pouch

For a more polished appearance, the original tutorial recommends lightly blocking the pieces.

Because the project uses cotton yarn, a small amount of moisture can help relax uneven stitches.

Gently shape the pouch to its intended dimensions.

Keep the edges straight and allow the piece to dry completely.

Avoid flattening the crochet rose while blocking.

The dimensional flower and leaves should remain raised.

Tips for a Professional Finish 💜

Keep your crochet tension consistent throughout the project. Even tension will make the rows cleaner and help the finished pouch maintain its shape.

Use fabric glue only as an optional reinforcement for the pearls and flower. Sewing the embellishments securely provides extra strength.

When attaching the rose, stitch primarily through its base so the individual petals stay three-dimensional.

Keep the pearl spacing consistent along the seam between the two colors.

Before permanently attaching the zipper, test its position and make sure both crochet edges are aligned.

If your pouch fabric curls slightly, light blocking can help create a cleaner, more professional finish.

Finished Crochet Zipper Pouch 🌹💜

Your Crochet Zipper Pouch with Rose Flower, Leaves, Pearls and Tassel is now complete!

The finished project combines a light purple single-crochet lower panel, dark purple upper panel, pearl embellishment, dimensional crochet rose, two leaves, decorative yarn tassel, and an 8-inch zipper.

The approximate finished size is:

20 cm (8 inches) wide × 13 cm (5 inches) high.

It can be used as a cosmetic pouch, notions bag, small accessory organizer, crochet-hook pouch, travel pouch, or handmade gift.

The combination of the dimensional flower, pearl trim, coordinated tassel, and two-tone crochet body gives the project an elegant handmade finish while keeping the basic construction accessible to crocheters who are comfortable with fundamental US crochet stitches.

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
